## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, further 5 providing for Keystone Exams. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 121 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, 10 No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, amended June 21, 2017 (P.L.200, No.6) and November 6, 2017 (P.L.1142, No.55), 11 12 is amended to read: 13 Section 121. Keystone Exams AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS. --(a) The Department of Education shall develop and implement 14 15 Keystone Exams in algebra I, literature and biology. The State 16 Board of Education shall promulgate OR REVISE regulations, <-subject to the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as 17 the "Regulatory Review Act," necessary to implement this 18 19 section.

- 1 (a.1) Upon the expiration of the delay on the use of
- 2 Keystone Exams as a graduation requirement and in any school
- 3 year in which a demonstration of proficiency on a Keystone Exam-

- 4 is required for high school graduation, a student who attains an
- 5 established composite score on the algebra I, biology and
- 6 literature Keystone Exams shall be deemed proficient if the
- 7 student achieves a basic or above performance level on each of
- 8 the three Keystone Exams. No later than September 30, 2019, the
- 9 secretary shall establish the satisfactory composite score a
- 10 student must attain in order to meet the requirements of this
- 11 <u>section and submit the proposed composite score to the State</u>
- 12 Board of Education for approval. The State Board of Education
- 13 <u>must approve a composite score no later than December 31, 2019.</u>
- 14 (A.1) (1) UPON THE EXPIRATION OF THE DELAY ON THE USE OF
- 15 KEYSTONE EXAMS AS A GRADUATION REQUIREMENT AND IN ANY SCHOOL
- 16 YEAR IN WHICH A DEMONSTRATION OF PROFICIENCY ON A KEYSTONE EXAM
- 17 <u>IS REQUIRED FOR HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION, A STUDENT WHO ATTAINS A</u>
- 18 SATISFACTORY COMPOSITE SCORE APPROVED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) ON THE
- 19 ALGEBRA I, BIOLOGY AND LITERATURE KEYSTONE EXAMS SHALL BE DEEMED
- 20 PROFICIENT FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION
- 21 REQUIREMENT.
- 22 (2) NO LATER THAN JULY 30, 2019, THE SECRETARY SHALL
- 23 RECOMMEND, AND THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL APPROVE, THE
- 24 SATISFACTORY COMPOSITE SCORE A STUDENT MUST ATTAIN IN ORDER TO
- 25 MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION. THE SATISFACTORY
- 26 COMPOSITE SCORE ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL:
- 27 <u>(I) REQUIRE A STUDENT TO ACHIEVE A PROFICIENT SCORE ON AT</u>
- 28 LEAST ONE OF THE THREE KEYSTONE EXAMS AND NO LESS THAN A BASIC
- 29 SCORE ON THE TWO REMAINING KEYSTONE EXAMS.
- 30 (II) BE CALCULATED BASED UPON THE MOST RECENT KEYSTONE EXAM

- 1 RESULTS AVAILABLE TO THE SECRETARY.
- 2 (3) EVERY FIVE YEARS, THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL
- 3 REVIEW THE OPERATION OF THE SATISFACTORY COMPOSITE SCORE
- 4 ESTABLISHED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) AND SHALL ISSUE A REPORT OF ITS
- 5 FINDINGS TO THE CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE EDUCATION
- 6 COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY CHAIRMAN
- 7 OF THE EDUCATION COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
- 8 (4) THE SATISFACTORY COMPOSITE SCORE ESTABLISHED UNDER
- 9 PARAGRAPH (2) SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNLESS THE SCORE IS CHANGED
- 10 BY AN ACT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
- 11 (5) THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL TRANSMIT NOTICE TO THE
- 12 LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO PUBLISH THE SATISFACTORY
- 13 COMPOSITE SCORE ESTABLISHED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) IN THE
- 14 PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PUBLISH THE
- 15 <u>SATISFACTORY COMPOSITE SCORE ON THE DEPARTMENT'S PUBLICLY</u>
- 16 ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE.
- 17 (b) The following shall apply:
- 18 (1) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code §
- 19 4.24 (relating to high school graduation requirements), 4.51
- 20 (relating to State assessment system) or 4.51c (relating to
- 21 project-based assessment) or any statute or regulation to the
- 22 contrary, the use of the Keystone Exams as a graduation
- 23 requirement or as a benchmark for the need for participation in

- 24 a project-based assessment shall be delayed until the [2019-
- 25 2020] 2020-2021 school year.
- 26 (2) The Department of Education shall investigate and
- 27 develop alternatives in addition to the use of the Keystone
- 28 Exams as a requirement for graduation and shall, within six (6)
- 29 months of the effective date of this paragraph, issue a report
- 30 of the Department of Education's findings and recommendations,

- 1 including proposed legislation, to the chairman and minority
- 2 chairman of the Education Committee of the Senate and the
- 3 chairman and minority chairman of the Education Committee of the
- 4 House of Representatives. The report shall, at a minimum,
- 5 contain a detailed plan and timeline within which the Department
- 6 of Education shall accomplish all of the following:
- 7 (i) Implement alternative methods for students to
- 8 demonstrate proficiency for graduation in addition to the
- 9 Keystone Exams, the project-based assessments and other
- 10 alternative assessments provided for in 22 Pa. Code § 4.24.
- 11 (ii) Improve and expedite the evaluation of project-based
- 12 assessments.
- 13 (iii) Ensure that no student is prohibited from
- 14 participation in vocational-technical education or elective
- 15 courses or programs as a result of supplemental instruction
- 16 required in 22 Pa. Code §§ 4.24(k) and 4.51b(f) (relating to
- 17 Keystone Exams).
- 18 (b.1) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code
- 19 §§ 4.24 (relating to high school graduation requirements), 4.51 <--
- 20 <u>(relating to State assessment system)</u>, 4.51(b) 4.51B <u>(relating</u> <--
- 21 to Keystone Exams), 4.51(c) (relating to project based
- 22 <u>assessment) OR 4.51C or any statute or regulation to the</u>

- 23 contrary, in any school year in which a demonstration of
- 24 proficiency on a Keystone Exam is required for high school
- 25 graduation, the following shall apply:
- 26 (1) A student who does not demonstrate proficiency on a
- 27 <u>Keystone Exam or on a locally validated assessment under 22 Pa.</u>
- 28 Code § 4.24 may be offered supplemental instruction by the
- 29 student's public school entity. The supplemental instruction
- 30 must be consistent with the student's educational program and

- 1 <u>assist the student to attain proficiency in the State academic</u>
- 2 standards. In no case may a public school entity require a
- 3 student to participate in supplemental instruction.
- 4 (2) A student who is not deemed proficient on the Keystone <--
- 5 Exams in algebra I, literature and biology either under 22 Pa.
- 6 <u>Code Ch. 4 (relating to academic standards and assessment) or</u>
- 7 under subsection (a.1) shall consult with a public school
- 8 entity's designated administrator of the portfolios under
- 9 subsection (c.1)(2)(v) to determine the student's options for
- 10 graduating from high school. The student and designated
- 11 <u>administrator shall consider all pathways to graduation</u>,
- 12 <u>including the option of participating in supplemental</u>
- 13 instruction and retaking a Keystone Exam. A student's proximity
- 14 to proficiency on the Keystone Exams shall be considered as part
- 15 of this consultation.
- 16 (3) (2) A public school entity that offers supplemental
- 17 instruction shall design its supplemental instruction programs
- 18 to ensure students who accept the public school entity's offer
- 19 of supplemental instruction are able to participate in both
- 20 supplemental instruction and instruction related to their career
- 21 portfolios under 22 Pa. Code Ch. 339 (relating to vocational
- 22 education) or under any State plan developed by the Department
- 23 of Education and approved by the United States Department of
- 24 Education to comply with section 1111 of the Elementary and
- 25 Secondary Education Act of 1965 (Public Law 89-10, 20 U.S.C. \$
- 26 6311), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (Public Law

- 27 <del>114 95, 129 Stat. 1802), or a successor Federal statute</del>,
- 28 MILITARY OR POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION PLANS.
- 29 (4) (3) An offer of supplemental instruction to a student
- 30 enrolled in an area vocational-technical school or in a career

- 1 and technical education program offered by a school district,
- 2 <u>charter school</u>, <u>cyber charter school or regional charter school</u>
- 3 may not intrude into instructional time for career and technical
- 4 <u>education</u>. Supplemental instruction may not occur during a
- 5 <u>student's dedicated time in a career and technical education</u>
- 6 program to provide the student time to gain competence in the
- 7 <u>student's concentration area within a career and technical</u>
- 8 <u>education program as well as demonstrate a high likelihood of</u>
- 9 <u>success on an approved industry-based competency assessment.</u>
- 10 (4) No public school entity may be required to offer, <--
- 11 nor may any student be required to participate in or complete, a
- 12 project-based assessment as provided for in 22 Pa. Code § 4.51c.
- 13 (5) A STUDENT WITH A DISABILITY WHO SATISFACTORILY COMPLETES <--
- 14 <u>A SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAM DEVELOPED BY AN INDIVIDUALIZED</u>
- 15 EDUCATION PROGRAM TEAM UNDER THE INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES
- 16 EDUCATION ACT (PUBLIC LAW 91-230, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 ET SEQ.) AND
- 17 22 PA. CODE CH. 14 (RELATING TO SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES AND
- 18 PROGRAMS) THAT DOES NOT OTHERWISE MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS
- 19 SECTION SHALL BE GRANTED AND ISSUED A REGULAR HIGH SCHOOL
- 20 DIPLOMA BY THE STUDENT'S PUBLIC SCHOOL ENTITY.
- 21 (6) A STUDENT WHO ACHIEVES A SCORE OF PROFICIENT OR ADVANCED
- 22 ON A KEYSTONE EXAM SHALL NOT BE PERMITTED TO RETAKE THE EXAM.
- 23 (7) WHEN A STUDENT TRANSFERS FROM AN OUT-OF-STATE SCHOOL TO
- 24 A PUBLIC SCHOOL ENTITY IN THIS COMMONWEALTH, THE STUDENT'S
- 25 PUBLIC SCHOOL ENTITY SHALL DETERMINE WHETHER THE STUDENT'S
- 26 PERFORMANCE ON OUT-OF-STATE COURSEWORK AND ASSESSMENTS THAT ARE
- 27 <u>ALIGNED WITH THE STATE ACADEMIC STANDARDS ASSESSED BY EACH</u>
- 28 KEYSTONE EXAM SATISFY THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION. THE
- 29 PUBLIC SCHOOL ENTITY'S DUTY UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL BE
- 30 SUBJECT TO GUIDANCE THAT THE SECRETARY SHALL DEVELOP AND ISSUE

- 1 WITHIN 60 DAYS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBSECTION.
- 2 (c) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code §
- 3 4.24 or 4.51 or any statute or regulation to the contrary, in
- 4 any school year in which a demonstration of proficiency on a
- 5 Keystone Exam is required for high school graduation, a CTE
- 6 Concentrator shall be deemed proficient provided that the CTE
- 7 Concentrator shall meet all of the following requirements:
- 8 (1) completes locally established grade-based requirements
- 9 for academic content areas associated with each Keystone Exam on
- 10 which the CTE Concentrator did not achieve proficiency. For the
- 11 purposes of this paragraph, completion of grade-based
- 12 requirements in any science and technology and environment and
- 13 ecology course shall satisfy the requirements for the academic
- 14 content area associated with the Keystone Exam in biology; and
- 15 (2) completes one of the following:
- 16 (i) attains an industry-based competency certification
- 17 related to the CTE Concentrator's program of study; or
- 18 (ii) demonstrates a high likelihood of success on an
- 19 approved industry-based competency assessment or readiness for
- 20 continued meaningful engagement in the CTE Concentrator's
- 21 program of study as demonstrated by performance on benchmark
- 22 assessments, course grades and other factors consistent with the
- 23 CTE Concentrator's goals and career plan[.] and determined for
- 24 the CTE Concentrator by a chief school administrator in
- 25 consultation with an area vocational-technical school director
- 26 or principal of a comprehensive high school no later than. THE
- 27 <u>DETERMINATION SHALL BE MADE NO LATER THAN THE END OF ELEVENTH</u>
- 28 GRADE, OR, FOR A STUDENT ENROLLED IN A ONE-YEAR PROGRAM, the end
- 29 of the first semester of twelfth grade.
- 30 (c.1) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code §

- 1 4.24 or 4.51 or any statute or regulation to the contrary, in
- 2 any school year in which a demonstration of proficiency on a
- 3 <u>Keystone Exam is required for high school graduation, a student</u>
- 4 shall be deemed proficient if the student completes both of the
- 5 following:
- 6 (1) Locally established grade-based requirements in the
- 7 <u>associated academic content areas of the Keystone Exams. For the</u>
- 8 purposes of this paragraph, completion of grade-based
- 9 requirements in any science and technology and environment and
- 10 ecology course shall satisfy the requirements for the academic
- 11 content area associated with the Keystone Exam in biology.
- 12 (2) Any of the following:
- (i) completion of an advanced placement program exam or
- 14 <u>international baccalaureate diploma program exam in the</u>
- 15 <u>associated Keystone Exam content area at a score established by</u> <--
- 16 the secretary RECOMMENDED BY THE SECRETARY IN CONSULTATION WITH <--
- 17 THE TRANSFER AND ARTICULATION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE AND APPROVED
- 18 BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION OR ESTABLISHED BY AN ACT OF THE
- 19 GENERAL ASSEMBLY to be comparable to the proficient level on the
- 20 appropriate Keystone Exam;
- 21 (ii) completion of the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude
- 22 Battery Test at a performance level that would qualify the
- 23 <u>student for military enlistment;</u>
- 24 (iii) receipt of a certification that the student will begin
- 25 work in a registered apprenticeship program following high
- 26 school graduation;
- 27 (iv) attainment of a career readiness certificate through
- 28 satisfactory completion of the ACT WorkKeys assessment; or
- 29 <u>(v) presentation of three or more rigorous and compelling</u>
- 30 pieces of evidence that reflect the student's readiness for

- 1 graduation. The evidence must be part of the student's portfolio
- 2 <u>under 22 Pa. Code Ch. 339 (relating to vocational education) or</u>
- 3 required by any State plan developed by the Department of
- 4 Education and approved by the United States Department of
- 5 Education to comply with section 1111 of the Elementary and
- 6 Secondary Education Act of 1965 (Public Law 89-10, 20 U.S.C. §
- 7 6311), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (Public Law
- 8 114 95, 129 Stat. 1802) or its successor Federal statute, and
- 9 <u>must relate to the student's career or postsecondary education</u>
- 10 plans reflected in the portfolio. The rigorous and compelling
- 11 pieces of evidence may include, but shall not be limited to, the
- 12 <u>following:</u>
- 13 (A) Achievement of a passing grade in a dual enrollment
- 14 <u>course or any postsecondary course at an accredited nonprofit</u>
- 15 institution of higher education.
- 16 (IV) COMPLETION OF THE GENERAL SAT OR ACT AT A
- 17 PERFORMANCE LEVEL RECOMMENDED BY THE SECRETARY AND APPROVED BY

- 18 THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION;
- 19 (V) EVIDENCE OF ADMISSION TO, OR SCHOLARSHIP AWARD FROM, AN
- 20 ACCREDITED NONPROFIT INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION;
- 21 (VI) ACHIEVEMENT OF A PASSING GRADE IN A DUAL ENROLLMENT
- 22 COURSE OR ANY POSTSECONDARY COURSE AT AN ACCREDITED NONPROFIT
- 23 INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION; OR
- 24 (VII) IF PERMITTED BY THE PUBLIC SCHOOL ENTITY, AND IF
- 25 ELECTED BY A STUDENT, PRESENTATION OF RIGOROUS AND COMPELLING
- 26 PIECES OF OBJECTIVE EVIDENCE APPROVED BY THE CHIEF SCHOOL
- 27 ADMINISTRATOR OR THEIR DESIGNEE THAT REFLECT THE STUDENT'S
- 28 READINESS FOR GRADUATION AND RELATE TO THE STUDENT'S CAREER,
- 29 MILITARY OR POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION PLANS. THE PIECES OF
- 30 EVIDENCE ELIGIBLE TO BE PRESENTED AND THE MINIMUM NUMBER OF

- 1 PIECES OF EVIDENCE REQUIRED SHALL BE RECOMMENDED BY THE
- 2 SECRETARY AND APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION, AND THE
- 3 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL ISSUE GUIDANCE FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL
- 4 ENTITIES TO FOLLOW WHEN APPLYING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
- 5 SUBPARAGRAPH. THE PIECES OF EVIDENCE RECOMMENDED BY THE
- 6 SECRETARY AND APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL
- 7 INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING:
- 8 (A) Completion of any advanced placement program exam or
- 9 <u>international baccalaureate diploma program exam at a score</u>
- 10 established RECOMMENDED by the secretary.
- 11 (C) Evidence of admission to an accredited nonprofit
- 12 <u>institution of higher education</u>.
- 13 <del>(D)</del> IN CONSULTATION WITH THE TRANSFER AND ARTICULATION <--

- 14 OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE AND APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION
- 15 OR ESTABLISHED BY AN ACT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
- 16 (B) A quaranteed full-time employment letter IN A CAREER <--
- 17 FIELD CONSISTENT WITH THE STUDENT'S CAREER OR POSTSECONDARY
- 18 EDUCATION PLANS.
- 19 <del>(E)</del> (C) Attainment of an industry-recognized credential, as <--
- 20 approved by the Department of Education and identified in the
- 21 industry credential resource book compiled by the department's
- 22 Bureau of Career and Technical Education.
- 23 <del>(F)</del> (D) A certificate of successful completion of an <--
- 24 internship, externship or cooperative education program.
- 25 (G) (E) Completion of an SAT or ACT subject-specific test at <--
- 26 a performance level established RECOMMENDED by the secretary. IN <--
- 27 <u>CONSULTATION WITH THE TRANSFER AND ARTICULATION OVERSIGHT</u>
- 28 COMMITTEE AND APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION OR
- 29 ESTABLISHED BY AN ACT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
- 30 (H) (F) Satisfactory compliance with the National Collegiate <--

- 1 Athletic Association's core courses for college-bound student
- 2 athletes with a minimum GPA of 2.0 or the equivalent on an
- 3 alternative grading scale.
- 4 (c.2) A student, in consultation with a public school <--
- 5 entity's designated administrator of the portfolios under
- 6 <u>subsection (c.1)(2)(v), shall develop the student's portfolio</u>
- 7 <u>under subsection (c.1) throughout the student's educational</u>
- 8 career and in accordance with quidance provided by the
- 9 <u>Department of Education</u>.
- 10 (c.3) A public school entity shall establish policies and
- 11 procedures for the development of the portfolios under
- 12 <u>subsection (c.1)(2)(v) consistent with guidance issued by the</u>
- 13 <u>Department of Education</u>.
- 14 (G) SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF A COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT <--
- 15 THAT RECEIVED ADVANCE APPROVAL FOR USE AS A RIGOROUS AND
- 16 OBJECTIVE PIECE OF EVIDENCE BY A CHIEF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR OR
- 17 THEIR DESIGNEE. A COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT SHALL INCLUDE IN-
- 18 SCHOOL, LOCAL, STATE, NATIONAL OR GLOBAL PROJECTS.
- 19 (H) ATTAINMENT OF A SCORE OF PROFICIENT OR ADVANCED ON A
- 20 KEYSTONE EXAM.
- 21 (I) ATTAINMENT OF A CAREER READINESS CERTIFICATE THROUGH
- 22 SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF THE ACT WORKKEYS ASSESSMENT.
- 23 (C.2) IN ACCORDANCE WITH 22 PA. CODE § 4.51(F), AND
- 24 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, A PUBLIC SCHOOL
- 25 ENTITY SHALL NOT RELEASE INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PENNSYLVANIA SYSTEM
- 26 OF SCHOOL ASSESSMENT OR KEYSTONE EXAM SCORES TO THE DEPARTMENT
- 27 OF EDUCATION OR OTHER COMMONWEALTH ENTITIES.
- 28 (C.3) THE PERFORMANCE LEVEL DEMONSTRATED IN EACH OF THE
- 29 STATE ACADEMIC STANDARDS, INCLUDING THE HIGHEST PERFORMANCE
- 30 LEVEL DEMONSTRATED BY A STUDENT ON THE ASSOCIATED KEYSTONE EXAM,

- 1 MAY BE INCLUDED ON A STUDENT'S TRANSCRIPT AS DETERMINED LOCALLY
- 2 BY EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL ENTITY.
- 3 (C.4) NO LATER THAN THE BEGINNING OF THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL
- 4 YEAR, EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL ENTITY SHALL ENSURE STUDENTS, PARENTS
- 5 AND GUARDIANS ARE NOTIFIED OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL ENTITY'S HIGH
- 6 SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS, INCLUDING REQUIREMENTS
- 7 ESTABLISHED IN LAW AND REGULATIONS AND ANY ADDITIONAL
- 8 REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED BY THE PUBLIC SCHOOL ENTITY, AND SHALL
- 9 PUBLISH ITS HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS ON ITS PUBLICLY
- 10 ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE.
