AN ACT

Amending Titles 30 (Fish) and 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in fishing licenses, further providing 2 for disabled veterans and former prisoners of war and for 3 exemptions from license requirements; and, in hunting and furtaking licenses, further providing for eligibility for 5 license, for resident license and fee exemptions and for 6 license costs and fees. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 2707(b) of Title 30 of the Pennsylvania 11 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a paragraph to read: 12 § 2707. Disabled veterans and former prisoners of war. 13 14 (b) Lifetime licenses. --* * * 15 (3) A disabled veteran who holds a resident fishing 16 17 license and meets the qualifications of subsection (a) (2) 18 may, at the option of the applicant, upon reaching the 19 veteran's 65th birthday in the license year of the 20 application for the license, be issued a senior resident
