- 13 action as well as educational and professional advancement
- 14 through service, leadership and empowerment; and

- 16 Theta have led countless initiatives addressing crucial
- 17 Statewide issues, including voter registration and education,
- 18 equal educational opportunities for all children, financial
- 19 literacy and economic empowerment, academic and financial

- 2 access to quality and affordable health care; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Delta Sigma Theta boasts 21 Statewide chapters
- 4 within this Commonwealth; and
