## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of April 2018 as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Widespread public awareness is the first step in
- 4 addressing sexual assault and its prevention; and
- 5 WHEREAS, According to the National Sexual Violence Resource
- 6 Center, one in five women and one in seventy-one men will be
- 7 raped at some point in their lives; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Of those, nearly 80% of women were raped before 25
- 9 years of age, with 40% experiencing their first rape between the
- 10 ages of 11 and 17, and 28% of men were first raped before their
- 11 10th birthday; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Forty-four percent of women and 23% of men
- 13 experienced other forms of sexual violence during their lives,
- 14 including sexual coercion, unwanted sexual contact and other
- 15 noncontact sexual experiences; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Most victims of sexual assault are acquainted with

- 1 their assailants; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Young people experience heightened rates of sexual
- 3 violence; and
- 4 WHEREAS, One in four girls and one in six boys will be
- 5 sexually abused before reaching 18 years of age; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Being the victim of child sexual abuse doubles the
- 7 likelihood of adult sexual victimization; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Sexual assault is a significant problem; and
- 9 WHEREAS, One in five women and one in sixteen men are
- 10 sexually assaulted during their time in college; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Sexual assault can have lasting, harmful effects on
- 12 survivors and their loved ones in our communities; and
- 13 WHEREAS, To preserve the safety and welfare of our fellow
- 14 citizens, we must confront harmful attitudes and actions; and
- 15 WHEREAS, To help the individual and social progress of our
- 16 fellow citizens, we must support survivors of sexual assault in
- 17 times of crisis and throughout their recovery; and
- 18 WHEREAS, To generate a comprehensive response to sexual
- 19 violence, we must highlight sexual assault prevention
- 20 initiatives, bolster criminal justice programs and commit to
- 21 breaking cycles of violence and reducing crime rates in our
- 22 communities; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Coalition Against Rape (PCAR) and a
- 24 network of 50 rape crisis centers partner with community members
- 25 to prevent sexual violence throughout this Commonwealth; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Funded by the Centers for Disease Control and
- 27 Prevention to operate the National Sexual Violence Resource
- 28 Center, PCAR develops and provides evidence-based prevention
- 29 programs, based on the principles of effective prevention; and
- 30 WHEREAS, The strategies are critical to the health of our

- 1 major social systems, such as schools, child care agencies,
- 2 workplaces, athletics, health care, legal systems and others to
- 3 move upstream and stop sexual violence before it occurs; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The 2018 Sexual Assault Awareness Month campaign is
- 5 focusing on resources related to campus sexual violence
- 6 prevention to create a culture on college campuses of prevention
- 7 and effective, trauma-informed response; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The campaign theme for 2018, "Embrace Your Voice,"
- 9 encourages every person to use their voice to speak out against
- 10 sexual violence and find ways to prevent sexual violence in
- 11 their roles and communities; therefore be it
- 12 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2018
- 13 as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
