2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 3 hereby enacts as follows:

4 Section 1. Private First Class Steve L. Klosz Memorial Bridge.
5 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
6 follows:

7 (1) Private First Class Steve L. Klosz was born November
8 29, 1915, in Cleveland, Ohio.

9 (2) Shortly after PFC Klosz was born, his family, which 10 immigrated to the United States from Hungary, moved to Twin 11 Rocks, Blacklick Township.

12 (3) PFC Klosz was drafted into the United States Army in13 July 1942 during World War II.

14 (4) Following basic training and radioman training, PFC15 Klosz was assigned to the 191st Tank Battalion.

16 (5) The 191st Tank Battalion first landed in North
17 Africa but did not see combat until it landed on the beach in
18 Salerno, Italy, in 1943.

19 (6) Beginning on September 9, 1943, the 191st Tank
20 Battalion engaged in Operation Avalanche in an attempt to
21 secure the beaches of Salerno.

22 (7) On September 11, 1943, PFC Klosz was killed in23 action.

24 (8) PFC Klosz was awarded the Purple Heart, the American
25 Campaign Medal and the World War II Victory Medal.

26 (9) The Twin Rocks Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #7605
27 is dedicated in memory of PFC Klosz.

(b) Designation.--The bridge, identified as Bridge Key 8675,
located on State Route 3047 over the South Branch of Blacklick
Creek, Blacklick Township, Cambria County, is designated the

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1 Private First Class Steve L. Klosz Memorial Bridge.

2 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
3 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
4 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

5 SECTION 2. POLICE OFFICER RAYMOND DIAZ, JR., MEMORIAL HIGHWAY. <--</p>
6 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
7 FOLLOWS:

8 (1) POLICE OFFICER RAYMOND DIAZ, JR., MADE THE ULTIMATE 9 SACRIFICE ON SEPTEMBER 9, 2016, WHEN HE DIED AS A RESULT OF 10 COMPLICATIONS FROM INJURIES SUSTAINED IN AN ACCIDENT WHEN HIS 11 PATROL CAR WAS STRUCK BY A VEHICLE WHILE RESPONDING TO A 12 BURGLARY.

13 (2) AS A RESULT OF THE ACCIDENT OFFICER DIAZ WAS
14 DIAGNOSED WITH CONCUSSION-LIKE SYMPTOMS AS WELL AS OTHER
15 INJURIES.

16 (3) OFFICER DIAZ WAS ASSIGNED TO THE 24TH POLICE
17 DISTRICT AND SERVED WITH THE PHILADELPHIA POLICE DEPARTMENT
18 FOR 20 YEARS.

19 (4) OFFICER DIAZ WAS SURVIVED BY HIS WIFE AND THREE20 CHILDREN.

(B) DESIGNATION.--THE 2100 TO 2200 BLOCK OF CASTOR AVENUE,
STATE ROUTE 1005, IN PHILADELPHIA COUNTY IS DESIGNATED THE
POLICE OFFICER RAYMOND DIAZ, JR., MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.

(C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.

27 SECTION 3. RICHARD L. SHAW MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.

28 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS29 FOLLOWS:

30 (1) RICHARD L. SHAW, BORN ON MAY 8, 1927, PASSED AWAY ON 20190HB0065PN2240 - 3 - 1 DECEMBER 29, 2018, AT 91 YEARS OF AGE.

2 (2) AFTER GRADUATING FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH
3 IN 1950 WITH A BUSINESS DEGREE, SHAW WENT TO WORK FOR THE
4 MICHAEL BAKER CORP., AN ENGINEERING FIRM, IN 1952. HE
5 PROGRESSED THROUGH VARIOUS LEADERSHIP POSITIONS BEFORE BEING
6 NAMED PRESIDENT IN 1973 AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER IN 1984.

7 (3) HE RETIRED AS CEO OF MICHAEL BAKER CORP. IN 1992,
8 BUT RETURNED TO THAT ROLE THREE TIMES BETWEEN 1993 AND 2006,
9 FINALLY RETIRING IN 2008.

10 (4) SHAW SERVED FOR DECADES ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF
11 THE BEAVER COUNTY CORPORATION FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AS
12 WELL AS THE NEW BRIGHTON AREA SCHOOL BOARD.

(5) SHAW WAS A TRUSTEE OF BRIGHTON CENTER FOR YOUTH AND
SERVED ON THE BOARDS OF A NUMBER OF ORGANIZATIONS, INCLUDING
THE UNITED WAY OF BEAVER COUNTY, SALVATION ARMY, PENN STATEBEAVER, SOUTHWESTERN PENNSYLVANIA REGIONAL PLANNING
COMMISSION, ALLEGHENY COUNTY AIRPORT AUTHORITY, AMERICAN RED
CROSS AND BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA.

19 (6) IN HIS CAPACITY AT MICHAEL BAKER CORP., SHAW ALSO
20 COMPLETED THE PROPERTY SURVEYS, SITE DESIGN AND CIVIL
21 PERMITTING FOR THE NEW HOME OF THE BEAVER COUNTY HUMANE
22 SOCIETY AT NO COST TO THE SOCIETY. THE PLAN FOR THE STATE-OF23 THE-ART FACILITY CAME TO FRUITION IN 2013.

(7) SHAW WAS A LEADING FORCE IN THE DESIGNATION OF ROUTE
60 AS INTERSTATE 376, WHICH SPARKED SIGNIFICANT ECONOMIC
DEVELOPMENT IN BEAVER COUNTY.

(8) A WORLD WAR II VETERAN, SHAW DEDICATED MORE THAN 60
YEARS TO SUPPORTING AND EXPANDING THE BUSINESS AND CIVIC
COMMUNITIES OF BEAVER COUNTY.

30 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE PORTION OF INTERSTATE 376 FROM THE END 20190HB0065PN2240 - 4 - OF THE BRIDGE IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY 3522 TO THE EXIT AT STATE
 ROUTE 51 IN BEAVER COUNTY, IS DESIGNATED THE RICHARD L. SHAW
 MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.

4 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND 5 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO 6 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.

7 SECTION 4. USAF COMBAT CONTROLLER STAFF SGT. DYLAN ELCHIN
 8 MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

9 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS 10 FOLLOWS:

(1) USAF COMBAT CONTROLLER STAFF SGT. DYLAN ELCHIN WAS
BORN JUNE 11, 1993, AND GAVE HIS LIFE IN THE LINE OF DUTY ON
NOVEMBER 27, 2018, AT 25 YEARS OF AGE.

14 (2) AFTER GRADUATING FROM HOPEWELL HIGH SCHOOL IN 2012,
15 STAFF SGT. ELCHIN JOINED THE UNITED STATE AIR FORCE AND WAS
16 STATIONED AT CANNON AIR FORCE BASE IN NEW MEXICO.

17 (3) STAFF SGT. ELCHIN WAS DEPLOYED TO SERVE IN THE ANDAR
18 DISTRICT OF THE GHAZNI PROVINCE IN AFGHANISTAN AS A JOINT
19 TERMINAL ATTACK CONTROLLER WITH THE 26TH SPECIAL TACTICS
20 SQUADRON.

(4) STAFF SGT. ELCHIN WAS A RECIPIENT OF THE BRONZE
STAR, THE PURPLE HEART, THE ARMY COMMENDATION MEDAL WITH
VALOR, THE AIR FORCE COMMENDATION MEDAL, THE AIR FORCE COMBAT
ACTION MEDAL, THE GOOD CONDUCT MEDAL, THE NATIONAL DEFENSE
SERVICE MEDAL, THE AFGHAN CAMPAIGN MEDAL, THE GLOBAL WAR ON
TERRORISM SERVICE MEDAL AND THE NATO MEDAL.

(5) THROUGHOUT HIS CAREER, STAFF SGT. ELCHIN STEADFASTLY
DISPLAYED EXCEEDING LOYALTY AND DEDICATION TO THE UNITED
STATES OF AMERICA AS WELL AS THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE.
PEOPLE WHO VALUE FREEDOM WILL FOREVER OWE HIM A DEBT THAT

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1 NEVER CAN BE REPAID.

2 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY 3522
3 ON THAT PORTION OF INTERSTATE 376 OVER THE OHIO RIVER IN VANPORT
4 TOWNSHIP, BEAVER COUNTY, IS DESIGNATED THE USAF COMBAT
5 CONTROLLER STAFF SGT. DYLAN ELCHIN MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

6 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
7 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
8 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.

9 SECTION 5. ALEX J. SZOKE HIGHWAY.

10 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
11 FOLLOWS:

12 (1) ALEX J. "SHONNY" SZOKE WAS RECOGNIZED FOR HIS RECORD
13 OF COMMUNITY COMMITMENT AND SERVICE BY A RESOLUTION OF THE
14 BOROUGH COUNCIL OF FLEETWOOD BOROUGH, BERKS COUNTY, ON
15 DECEMBER 10, 2018.

16 (2) MR. SZOKE AND HIS WIFE, GLORIA, WERE MARRIED FOR 65
17 YEARS BEFORE HIS DEATH ON NOVEMBER 18, 2018.

18 (3) HE ENLISTED IN THE UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS
19 RESERVE BEFORE GRADUATING FROM KUTZTOWN HIGH SCHOOL IN 1948,
20 AND SERVED IN THE UNITED STATES NAVY DURING THE KOREAN WAR.

21 (4) MR. SZOKE WAS A MEMBER OF FLEETWOOD BOROUGH COUNCIL
22 FOR 40 YEARS, SERVING MOST OF THAT TIME AS COUNCIL PRESIDENT.

23 (5) HE ALSO SERVED AS A CHURCH COUNCIL MEMBER OF 24 BECKER'S ST. PETER'S LUTHERAN CHURCH, MOLLTOWN; A FOUNDER OF 25 THE FLEETWOOD AREA BASEBALL ASSOCIATION (FABA); A CUB SCOUT MASTER FOR EVANSVILLE AND FLEETWOOD, AN OFFICER OF THE 26 FRATERNAL ORDER ORIOLES FLEETWOOD NEST 23; A SECRETARY OF HIS 27 28 UNION LOCAL AT ALLENTOWN PORTLAND CEMENT IN EVANSVILLE, PAST 29 CHAIR OF THE BERKS COUNTY DEMOCRATIC COMMITTEE, AND WINNER OF THE FULL BEARD AWARD DURING THE 1973 FLEETWOOD CENTENNIAL 30

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1 YEAR.

2 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE FIRST BLOCK OF WEST MAIN STREET, STATE
3 ROUTE 1010, IN FLEETWOOD BOROUGH, BERKS COUNTY, IS DESIGNATED
4 THE ALEX J. SZOKE HIGHWAY.

5 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND 6 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO 7 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.

8 SECTION 6. THOMAS J. KENNEDY, JR., MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

9 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS 10 FOLLOWS:

(1) THOMAS J. KENNEDY, JR., WAS BORN MAY 18, 1930, IN
THE CITY OF ERIE, ERIE COUNTY, AND SERVED THE UNITED STATES
IN THE MARINE CORPS, WHERE HE REACHED THE RANK OF CAPTAIN.

14 (2) CAPTAIN KENNEDY WAS THE SENIOR BATTALION ADVISOR TO
15 THE FIFTH BATTALION, VIETNAMESE MARINE BRIGADE, IN THE
16 HOSTILE AREA OF PHU AN, QUANG NGAI PROVINCE, VIETNAM.

(3) ON JUNE 12, 1966, CAPTAIN KENNEDY WAS WITH THE FIFTH
BATTALION COMMAND POST WHEN THE LEAD ELEMENTS WERE PINNED
DOWN BY HEAVY ENEMY FIRE AND THE COMMAND POST WAS DESTROYED
BY ENEMY MORTAR AND RIFLE FIRE, KILLING THE BATTALION
COMMANDER, THE BATTALION SURGEON, KEY STAFF OFFICERS AND
NUMEROUS SOLDIERS.

(4) ALTHOUGH SUFFERING MULTIPLE SHRAPNEL WOUNDS, CAPTAIN
KENNEDY LOCATED A RADIO AND, WITH HIS LAST BREATH, REPORTED
THE SITUATION, ALLOWING THE BATTALION TO SET UP A DEFENSIVE
PERIMETER AND REPULSE REPEATED ENEMY ATTACKS.

(5) DESPITE HIS MORTAL WOUNDS, CAPTAIN KENNEDY PREVENTED
ENEMY FORCES FROM OVERRUNNING THE REMAINING BATTALION UNITS
AND VALIANTLY GAVE HIS LIFE PROTECTING THE LIVES OF HIS
FELLOW MARINES.

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(6) FOR CONSPICUOUS GALLANTRY AND INTREPIDITY IN ACTION,
 CAPTAIN KENNEDY WAS POSTHUMOUSLY AWARDED THE SILVER STAR, THE
 THIRD-HIGHEST PERSONAL DECORATION FOR VALOR IN COMBAT.

4 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY
5 15986, ON THAT PORTION OF INTERSTATE 79 NORTHBOUND OVER WEST
6 16TH STREET IN THE CITY OF ERIE, ERIE COUNTY, IS DESIGNATED THE
7 THOMAS J. KENNEDY, JR., MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

8 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND 9 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO 10 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.

11 SECTION 7. A. DONALD BUFFINGTON MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

12 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS 13 FOLLOWS:

14

(1) A. DONALD BUFFINGTON WAS BORN DECEMBER 16, 1929.

15 (2) MR. BUFFINGTON GRADUATED IN 1947 FROM THE FORMER
16 HEGINS TOWNSHIP HIGH SCHOOL AND IN 1949 FROM THE FORMER
17 ECKLES COLLEGE OF MORTUARY SCIENCE, PHILADELPHIA.

18 (3) MR. BUFFINGTON FAITHFULLY SERVED HIS COMMUNITY AS A
19 BOARD MEMBER OF THE VALLEY VIEW PARK ASSOCIATION AND A BOARD
20 MEMBER OF THE TRI-VALLEY SCHOOL BOARD FOR SEVERAL DECADES.

(4) MR. BUFFINGTON SPENT SEVERAL DECADES OF TIME
 MAINTAINING THE VALLEY VIEW PARK WHICH INCLUDED PAINTING AND
 CUTTING GRASS.

(5) MR. BUFFINGTON WAS A COACH FOR THE HEGINS VALLEY
TEENER LEAGUE AND WAS THE FIRST TEENER LEAGUE COACH FROM
SCHUYLKILL COUNTY TO WIN THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1970.

27 (6) MR. BUFFINGTON PLAYED AND COACHED SEMI-PRO BASEBALL28 IN THE AREA FOR MANY YEARS.

29 (7) MR. BUFFINGTON WAS THE FUNERAL DIRECTOR FOR THE
 30 FORMER BUFFINGTON FUNERAL HOME AND THE BUFFINGTON-REED

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1 FUNERAL HOME, BOTH OF VALLEY VIEW.

2 (8) MR. BUFFINGTON WAS A MEMBER OF FRIEDENS UNITED
3 CHURCH OF CHRIST IN HEGINS, VALLEY VIEW GUN CLUB AND VALLEY
4 VIEW FIRE COMPANY.

5 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE LOCATED ON STATE ROUTE 4011
6 OVER PINE CREEK, HEGINS TOWNSHIP, SCHUYLKILL COUNTY, IS
7 DESIGNATED THE A. DONALD BUFFINGTON MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

8 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND 9 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO 10 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.

11 SECTION 8. DUSTER-QUAD 50-SEARCHLIGHT HIGHWAY.

12 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
13 FOLLOWS:

14 (1) DUSTERS, QUAD .50S AND SEARCHLIGHTS WERE WEAPONS
15 USED BY THE UNITED STATES ARMY, GROUPED TOGETHER AS SEPARATE
16 SMALL UNITS, AND DEPLOYED TO VIETNAM STARTING IN 1966 AND
17 ENDING IN 1972.

18 (2) DUSTER WAS THE NICKNAME GIVEN TO A WEAPON MOUNTED ON
19 A TANK CHASSIS WITH TWO 40 MM GUNS MOUNTED ON TOP.

20 (3) QUAD 50 WAS THE NICKNAME FOR A WEAPON THAT HAD
21 FOUR .50 CALIBER MACHINE GUNS MOUNTED ON THE BACK OF A TWO
22 AND ONE-HALF TON TRUCK.

(4) SEARCHLIGHTS PROVIDED WHITE LIGHT AND INFRARED
24 ILLUMINATION TO ASSIST THE UNITED STATES ARMY IN THE DEFENSE
25 OF COMBAT BASES AT NIGHT.

(5) SEVERAL HUNDRED SOLDIERS FROM THIS COMMONWEALTH
 SERVED IN UNITS HEAVILY ARMED WITH DUSTERS, QUAD .50S AND
 SEARCHLIGHTS.

29 (6) THE 1ST BATTALION, 44TH ARTILLERY, WITH BATTERY G OF
30 THE 65TH ARTILLERY AND BATTERY G OF THE 29TH ARTILLERY

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ATTACHED, WAS THE HIGHEST DECORATED UNIT OF ITS SIZE TO FIGHT
 IN THE VIETNAM WAR.

3 (7) AS A UNIT EQUIPPED WITH DUSTERS, QUAD .50S AND
4 SEARCHLIGHTS, THE UNIT WAS AWARDED OVER 450 MEDALS FOR VALOR,
5 INCLUDING THE MEDAL OF HONOR, AND WAS AWARDED OVER 1000
6 PURPLE HEARTS.

7 (8) DURING THE VIETNAM WAR, UNITS EQUIPPED WITH DUSTERS,
8 QUAD .50S AND SEARCHLIGHTS SUFFERED THE LOSS OF 211 SOLDIERS,
9 INCLUDING FIVE SOLDIERS FROM THIS COMMONWEALTH.

3 (4) LT. COL. WARMAN WAS AN EXPERT IN POST-TRAUMATIC
4 STRESS DISORDER AND TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY.

5 (5) LT. COL. WARMAN SERVED A YEAR IN GERMANY AT 6 LANDSTUHL REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER, A MEDICAL FACILITY WHERE 7 SOLDIERS WOUNDED IN AFGHANISTAN AND IRAQ WERE TREATED BEFORE 8 BEING RETURNED TO THE UNITED STATES, AND REGULARLY 9 VOLUNTEERED FOR TRIPS TO CARE FOR SOLDIERS BEING TRANSPORTED 10 TO LANDSTUHL.

11 (6) FOR HER MERITORIOUS SERVICE AT LANDSTUHL, LT. COL.
12 WARMAN WAS AWARDED THE ARMY COMMENDATION MEDAL IN 2006.

13 (7) ON NOVEMBER 5, 2009, WHILE AT THE SOLDIER READINESS
14 PROCESSING CENTER IN FORT HOOD, TEXAS FOR DEPLOYMENT TO IRAQ,
15 LT. COL WARMAN WAS KILLED DURING A SHOOTING RAMPAGE IN WHICH
16 13 PEOPLE WERE KILLED AND 30 MORE WERE INJURED.

17 (8) LT. COL. WARMAN'S MILITARY CAREER SPANNED 25 YEARS
18 IN ACTIVE DUTY AND THE ARMY RESERVES.

19 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE SECTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 50 IN 20 INDEPENDENCE TOWNSHIP, WASHINGTON COUNTY, FROM SEGMENT 70 TO 21 SEGMENT 80 IS DESIGNATED THE LT. COL. JUANITA L. WARMAN MEMORIAL 22 HIGHWAY.

(C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
