1 2 3	Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in licensing of drivers, providing for amnesty program for traffic violations.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Chapter 15 of Title 75 is amended by adding a
7	subchapter to read:

17	<u>§ 1591. Definitions.</u>
18	The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter

1	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
2	context clearly indicates otherwise:
3	"Court." The court in which the original fine was imposed on
4	the individual who committed an eligible violation of this
5	<u>title.</u>
6	"Program." The amnesty program established under section
7	1592 (relating to amnesty program).
8	<u>§ 1592. Amnesty program.</u>
9	(a) EstablishmentThe department, in consultation with the
10	Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, shall establish a
11	driver's license amnesty program. The amnesty period shall begin
12	on the effective date of this section and end 12 months after
13	the effective date of this section.
14	(b) PurposesThe program shall provide individuals the
15	opportunity to have their operating privileges restored upon
16	payment in full of any court-ordered obligations and upon
17	completing any suspension of operating privileges required for
18	the underlying violations.
19	(c) DutiesThe department, in consultation with the
20	Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, shall:
21	(1) Make a reasonable effort to determine if an
22	individual owes court-ordered obligations which resulted in a
23	suspension of the individual's operating privileges under
24	section 1553(a) and (d) (relating to occupational limited
25	<u>license).</u>
26	(2) Notify the individual of court-ordered obligations.
27	(3) Provide information as to which court the individual
28	<u>must make payment.</u>
29	(4) Require the department to restore the operating
30	privileges of an individual upon satisfactorily meeting the

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1	requirements	of	the	program.

2	(d) EligibilityAn individual who participates in the
3	program shall not be eligible to participate in a comparable
4	amnesty program if one is subsequently established. The program
5	shall be available to an individual who meets the following
6	<u>criteria:</u>
7	(1) The individual's operating privileges have been
8	<u>indefinitely suspended under section 1553(a) or (d) prior to</u>
9	the effective date of this subsection.
10	(2) The individual's operating privileges have been
11	suspended for a conviction of section 1543(a) (relating to
12	driving while operating privilege is suspended or revoked)
13	resulting from an indefinite suspension under section 1553(a)
14	or (d) prior to the effective date of this section.
15	(3) The individual has served any operating privilege
16	suspension required by the underlying offense which resulted
17	in violation of section 1553(a) or (d).
18	(e) ProhibitionsThe following shall apply:
19	(1) An individual shall be prohibited from receiving
20	amnesty for convictions for violations committed after the
21	effective date of this subsection.
22	(2) Any payment regarding a fine, fee or penalty that
23	was made prior to the effective date of this subsection shall
24	be ineligible for a refund under this subchapter.
25	(f) ReinstatementThe department shall not be required to
26	reinstate the operating privilege of an individual under this
27	subchapter if the department is authorized under this title to
28	suspend the operating privilege of the individual for other
29	violations of this title.
30	(g) ComplianceThe department shall not be required to

1	restore the operating privilege of an individual under this
2	subchapter until the individual has complied with section 1593
3	(relating to program requirements).
4	<u>§ 1593. Program requirements.</u>
5	(a) FormAn individual who seeks to participate in the
6	program shall respond to the court pursuant to the instructions
7	in a restoration letter which shall be provided by the
8	department.
9	(b) Satisfaction of payments owedThe individual is
10	required to pay 100% of the original penalty and any other
11	court-ordered obligations imposed under the applicable laws of
12	this Commonwealth.
13	(c) RequirementsIn addition to the requirements under
14	section 1960 (relating to reinstatement of operating privilege
15	or vehicle registration), an individual applying for the program
16	shall:
17	(1) attach to the petition a certified copy of the
18	drivers history; and
19	(2) perform one of the following:
20	(i) Pay all court-ordered obligations immediately or
21	<u>in a single remittance.</u>
22	(ii) If an individual is unable to pay all
23	obligations under subparagraph (i), the individual shall
24	either:
25	(A) pay in installments all court-ordered
26	obligations after a hearing conducted by the issuing
27	authority to determine the individual's ability to
28	pay and the issuance of an order providing for
29	installment payments; or
30	<u>(B) notwithstanding 42 Pa.C.S. § 1520(a)</u>

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1	(relating to adjudication alternative program),
2	complete a court-ordered public service or other
3	adjudication alternative program under 42 Pa.C.S. §
4	<u>1520(b).</u>
5	(d) Proof of financial responsibilityNotwithstanding
6	section 1783 (relating to proof of financial responsibility
7	before restoring operating privilege or registration), before
8	restoring operating privilege, the department shall require an
9	individual participating in the program to provide the
10	department with:
11	(1) proof of financial responsibility; or
12	(2) in the case of an individual who does not own a
13	motor vehicle currently registered in this Commonwealth, a
14	signed statement certifying that the individual does not own
15	a motor vehicle currently registered in this Commonwealth.
16	(e) CertificationThe court shall certify to the
17	department that an individual has satisfied the amounts owed
18	under the program and is eligible to have the individual's
19	operating privilege reinstated.
20	<u>§ 1594. Regulations.</u>
21	(a) PromulgationThe department, in consultation with the
22	Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, may promulgate
23	regulations to implement the provisions of this subchapter.
24	(b) GuidelinesThe department shall develop written
25	guidelines for the implementation of this subchapter. The
26	guidelines shall be in effect until the department promulgates
27	regulations for the implementation of the provisions of this
28	subchapter.
29	<u>§ 1595. Use of revenue.</u>
30	All revenue received by the court pursuant to the program

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1	shall be distributed in accordance with law.
2	§ 1596. Proceedings relating to amnesty violations barred.
3	Participation in the program is conditioned upon the
4	individual's agreement that the right to protest or pursue an
5	administrative or judicial proceeding against the department
6	with regard to violations listed on the amnesty request is
7	barred.
8	Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows:
9	(1) The following shall take effect immediately:
10	(i) The addition of 75 Pa.C.S. § 1594(b).
11	(ii) This section.
12	(2) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 180
13	days.
