AN ACT

Amending the act of October 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, No.261), entitled "An act requiring the licensing of practitioners of 2 osteopathic medicine and surgery; regulating their practice; 3 providing for certain funds and penalties for violations and 4 repeals," further providing for genetic counselor. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 7 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 10.3(c) of the act of October 5, 1978 8 (P.L.1109, No.261), known as the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act, is amended to read: 10 11 Section 10.3. Genetic counselor. 12 * * * 13 (c) Scope of practice. --14 A genetic counselor may provide genetic counseling 15 to clients, which includes: 16 Obtain and evaluate individual and family 17 medical histories to determine genetic risk for genetic 18 or medical conditions and diseases in a patient and other 19 family members.

- 1 (ii) Discuss the features, natural history, means of 2 diagnosis, genetic and environmental factors and 3 management of risk for the genetic or medical conditions 4 and diseases.
 - (iii) Identify, order and coordinate genetic laboratory tests and other diagnostic studies as appropriate for the genetic assessment.
 - (iv) Integrate the genetic laboratory test results and other diagnostic studies with personal and family medical histories to assess and communicate risk factors for genetic or medical conditions and diseases.
 - (v) Explain the clinical implications of genetic laboratory tests and other diagnostic studies and their results.
 - (vi) Evaluate the client's or family's responses to the condition or risk of the recurrence and provide client-centered counseling.
 - (vii) Identify and utilize community resources that provide medical, educational, financial and psychosocial support and advocacy.
 - (viii) Provide written documentation of medical,
 genetic and counseling information for families and
 health care professionals.
 - (2) When in the course of providing genetic counseling services to a client, if a genetic counselor finds any indication of a disease or condition that requires diagnosis and treatment outside the scope of practice defined in this section, the genetic counselor shall refer the client to a licensed physician or appropriate health care practitioner.
 - (3) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to

- 1 authorize a genetic counselor to diagnose[, test] or treat
- 2 any genetic disease or condition or other disease or
- 3 condition.

- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
