## AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public 2 welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in departmental powers and 3 duties as to licensing, further providing for definitions and 4 providing for food allergy guidelines. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. Section 1001 of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a definition to read: 10 Section 1001. Definitions .-- As used in this article --11 12 13 "Anaphylaxis" means a life-threatening allergic reaction that 14 is rapid in onset. \* \* \* 15 16 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: 17 Section 1021.1. Food Allergy Guidelines. -- (a) No later than

January 1, 2020, the department, in conjunction with the

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- 1 child care center for managing a child with a life-threatening
- 2 food allergy. The quidelines shall contain all of the following:
- 3 (1) Training on administering medication with a cartridge
- 4 <u>injector</u>.
- 5 (2) Procedures to ensure that a child's self-injectable
- 6 epinephrine is available to child care center personnel.
- 7 (3) Reasonable accommodations to reduce the risk of a child
- 8 being exposed to anaphylaxis-causing agents located in areas of
- 9 <u>school activity.</u>
- 10 (4) Protocols on responding to life-threatening allergic
- 11 <u>reactions.</u>
- 12 <u>(5) Procedures for implementing an individualized health</u>
- 13 <u>care and food allergy plan.</u>
- 14 (b) No later than September 30 of each year, a child care
- 15 center shall establish a food allergy policy in accordance with
- 16 the guidelines under subsection (a) and shall provide notice of
- 17 the policy to the parent or legal quardian of each enrolled
- 18 child.
- 19 (c) A parent or legal guardian of a child enrolled in a
- 20 child care center who has a known food allergy shall submit to
- 21 the child care center all of the following:
- 22 (1) A list of foods that may cause the child to have an
- 23 allergic reaction.
- 24 (2) Medication prescribed for the child to treat the food
- 25 allergy or anaphylaxis.
- 26 (3) Symptoms that may indicate the child is having an
- 27 allergic reaction to food.
- 28 (4) Emergency treatment procedures to use if the child has
- 29 <u>an allergic reaction to food.</u>
- 30 (5) Contact information of the individual if the child has

- 1 <u>an allergic reaction to food.</u>
- 2 (6) Contact information of the child's primary health care
- 3 <u>provider.</u>
- 4 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
