Amending the act of December 8, 1959 (P.L.1718, No.632),

AN ACT

entitled "An act providing for the payment of the salary, 2 medical and hospital expenses of employes of State penal and 3 correctional institutions, State mental hospitals, Youth Development Centers, County Boards of Assistance, and under 5 certain conditions other employes of the Department of Public 6 Welfare, who are injured in the performance of their duties; 7 and providing benefit to their widows and dependents in 8 certain cases," further providing for a limitation on salary 9 payments to employees. 10 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. Section 1 of the act of December 8, 1959 14 (P.L.1718, No.632), entitled "An act providing for the payment 15 of the salary, medical and hospital expenses of employes of 16 State penal and correctional institutions, State mental 17 hospitals, Youth Development Centers, County Boards of 18 Assistance, and under certain conditions other employes of the 19 Department of Public Welfare, who are injured in the performance 20 of their duties; and providing benefit to their widows and 21 dependents in certain cases," is amended to read: 22 Section 1. Any employe of a State penal or correctional

- 1 institution under the Bureau of Correction of the Department of
- 2 Justice and any employe of a State mental hospital or Youth
- 3 Development Center under the Department of [Public Welfare]
- 4 <u>Human Services</u>, who is injured during the course of [his]
- 5 employment by an act of any inmate or any person confined in
- 6 such institution or by any person who has been committed to such
- 7 institution by any court of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or
- 8 by any provision of the ["Mental Health Act"] act of July 9,
- 9 1976 (P.L.817, No.143), known as the Mental Health Procedures
- 10 Act, and any employe of County Boards of Assistance injured by
- 11 act of an applicant for or recipient of public assistance and
- 12 any employe of the Department of [Public Welfare] Human Services
- 13 who has been assigned to or who has volunteered to join the fire
- 14 fighting force of any institution of the Department of [Public
- 15 Welfare] <u>Human Services</u> injured while carrying out fire fighting
- 16 duties, shall be paid, by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania,
- 17 [his] the employe's full salary[,] for no more than three years_
- 18 from the date of the injury, or until the disability arising
- 19 therefrom no longer prevents [his] the employe's return as an
- 20 employe of such department, board or institution at a salary
- 21 equal to that earned by [him] the employe at the time of [his]
- 22 injury, whichever is sooner.
- 23 All medical and hospital expenses incurred in connection with
- 24 any such injury shall be paid by the Commonwealth of
- 25 Pennsylvania for no more than three years from the date of the
- 26 <u>injury</u>, or until the disability arising from such injury no
- 27 longer prevents [his] the employe's return as an employe of such
- 28 department, board or institution at a salary equal to that
- 29 earned by [him] the employe at the time of [his] injury.
- 30 whichever is sooner.

- 1 During the time salary for such disability shall be paid by
- 2 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania any workmen's compensation
- 3 received or collected for such period shall be turned over to
- 4 the Commonwealth and paid into the General Fund, and if such
- 5 payment shall not be so made, the amount so due the Commonwealth
- 6 shall be deducted from any salary then or thereafter becoming
- 7 due and owing.
- 8 The [widow] <u>surviving spouse</u> and minor dependents of any
- 9 employe who dies within one year as a result of such injuries
- 10 shall be paid benefits equal to fifty per cent of the full
- 11 salary of the deceased employe.
- 12 When a [widow] <u>surviving spouse</u> and minor dependents not in
- 13 [her] the surviving spouse's custody are entitled to payments,
- 14 one-half of such payments shall be paid to the [widow] surviving
- 15 <u>spouse</u> and one-half to the dependents. In every case the amount
- 16 payable to minor dependents shall be divided equally among them
- 17 and be paid to the persons or institutions having custody of
- 18 them.
- In the case of a [widow] <u>surviving spouse</u> or a [widow]
- 20 <u>surviving spouse</u> with minor dependents in [her] <u>the surviving</u>
- 21 spouse's custody, such benefits shall terminate when such
- 22 [widow] <u>surviving spouse</u> remarries. In the case of minor
- 23 dependents, except when in the custody of a remarried [widow]
- 24 <u>surviving spouse</u>, such benefits shall terminate when all of the
- 25 minor dependents become eighteen years of age. Neither a [widow]
- 26 <u>surviving spouse</u> nor minor dependents shall receive any benefits
- 27 under this act while receiving benefits under the [Federal]
- 28 Social Security [Law] <u>Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 301 et</u>
- 29 seq.). The benefits provided by this act shall be reduced by the
- 30 amount of any workmen's compensation benefits received or

- 1 collected by any such [widow] <u>surviving spouse</u> or minor
- 2 dependents because of the same injury. Payments for the benefit
- 3 of minor dependents shall be made to the person having legal
- 4 custody of them.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
