AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in other required equipment, providing for heat detection devices in emergency vehicles. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 6 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 7 § 4574. Heat detection devices in emergency vehicles. 8 9 (a) General rule. -- Any emergency vehicle transporting a K-9 10 officer shall be equipped with a heat detection device. 11 (b) Heat detection device. -- A heat detection device installed in an emergency vehicle transporting a K-9 officer 12 shall, at a minimum: 1.3 14 (1) alert the vehicle operator that the vehicle has a 15 cabin temperature that is unsafe for the K-9 officer by utilizing the horn, sirens and lights; and 16 17 (2) automatically roll down two windows when the vehicle

reaches an unsafe cabin temperature.

- 1 (c) Regulations. -- The department shall promulgate
- 2 regulations governing the type, function, installation,
- 3 temperature limits and use of heat detection devices, taking
- 4 <u>into consideration different requirements for different classes</u>
- 5 or types of vehicles. The department shall have the authority to
- 6 regulate the performance of heat detection devices on a vehicle.
- 7 (d) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 8 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 9 <u>subsection:</u>
- 10 "Heat detection device." An apparatus that measures the
- 11 temperature inside a vehicle passenger space, alerts the vehicle
- 12 operator of unsafe temperatures inside the vehicle and activates
- 13 <u>vehicle electromechanical systems in order to cool the vehicle</u>
- 14 to a safe temperature.
- 15 "K-9 officer." A dog used by the Pennsylvania State Police,
- 16 <u>a police department established by a metropolitan transportation</u>
- 17 authority operating under 74 Pa.C.S. Ch. 17 (relating to
- 18 metropolitan transportation authorities), a police department
- 19 established under the act of April 6, 1956 (1955 P.L.1414,
- 20 No.465), known as the Second Class County Port Authority Act,
- 21 the Capitol Police, the Department of Corrections, a county
- 22 facility or office or a municipal police department, fire
- 23 department, search and rescue unit or agency or handler under
- 24 the supervision of the department, search and rescue unit or
- 25 agency in the performance of the functions or duties of the
- 26 department, search and rescue unit or agency, whether the animal
- 27 <u>is on duty or not on duty. The term shall include, but not be</u>
- 28 limited to, an accelerant detection dog, bomb detection dog,
- 29 narcotic detection dog, search and rescue dog and tracking
- 30 animal.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
