12	(2) (i) If a juvenile is charged with a violation of
13	paragraph (1), the judicial authority with jurisdiction
14	over the violation shall give first consideration to
15	referring the juvenile charged with the violation to a
16	diversionary program under Pa.R.J.C.P. No. 312 (relating
17	to Informal Adjustment) or No. 370 (relating to Consent
18	Decree). As part of the diversionary program, the

judicial authority [may] <u>shall</u> order the juvenile to 1 2 participate in an educational program which includes the 3 legal and nonlegal consequences of cyber harassment. (ii) If the person successfully completes the 4 diversionary program, the juvenile's records of the 5 6 charge of violating paragraph (1) shall be expunded as provided for under section 9123 (relating to juvenile 7 records). 8 9 (iii) A juvenile's parent or legal quardian shall be required to attend and complete the educational program 10 under subparagraph (i) with the juvenile. 11 * * 12 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
