9 § 10301. Definitions.

- The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 11 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Agriculture and youth organization." An organization
- 14 composed mainly of youth and organized to promote development in
- 15 the areas of agriculture, community leadership, vocational
- 16 training and peer fellowship. The term includes, but is not
- 17 limited to, Pennsylvania FFA, 4-H, Ag in the Classroom, the
- 18 Family, Career and Community Leaders of America and vocational
- 19 education programs.
- 20 "Board." The State Agriculture and Youth Development Board.
- 21 "Program." The Agriculture and Youth Organization Grant
- 22 Program.
- 23 § 10302. Board membership.
- 24 The board shall consist of the following members, with a
- 25 <u>majority of members constituting a quorum:</u>
- 26 (1) The secretary or a designee, who shall serve as
- 27 chairperson.
- 28 (2) The Secretary of Education or a designee.
- 29 <u>(3) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the</u>
- 30 Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee of the Senate or a

- designee and the chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 2 Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee of the House of
- Representatives or a designee.
- 4 (4) One representative from the Pennsylvania Association
- 5 <u>of Agriculture Educators and one from the Penn State</u>
- 6 <u>Cooperative Extension, both of whom shall be appointed by the</u>
- 7 Governor.
- 8 (5) The Statewide president of the Pennsylvania FFA.
- 9 <u>(6) The 4-H Statewide Council President.</u>
- 10 (7) Up to three representatives, each from a different
- 11 Pennsylvania farm or rural organization having a youth
- 12 program, whom shall be appointed by the secretary.
- 13 (8) A representative of an urban agriculture community
- 14 <u>program.</u>
- 15 (9) A youth representative of an urban garden operation
- or another urban agriculture operation.
- 17 § 10303. Agriculture and Youth Organization Grant Program.
- 18 (a) Program. -- The department, in consultation with the
- 19 board, shall establish a program of grants for agriculture and
- 20 youth organizations qualifying to receive grants under this
- 21 chapter, to be known as the Agriculture and Youth Organization
- 22 Grant Program.
- 23 (b) Purpose. -- Grants awarded under this chapter may be used
- 24 for any of the following purposes:
- 25 (1) To cover the costs of special projects conducted by
- the organization and approved by the board.
- 27 (2) For educational or work force development programs
- conducted by the organization and approved by the board.
- 29 (3) For educational or work force development seminars
- and field trips conducted by the organization and approved by

- 1 the board.
- 2 (4) For agricultural safety training programs conducted
- 3 by the organization and approved by the board.
- 4 <u>(5) For certain capital projects and equipment purchases</u>
- 5 <u>approved by the board.</u>
- 6 § 10304. Applications.
- 7 (a) Application procedure. -- An agriculture and youth
- 8 organization may make application at the time, in the manner and
- 9 containing information as the department may require. The
- 10 department shall determine, from the information provided,
- 11 whether the application is eligible for consideration by the
- 12 board.
- 13 (b) Annual meeting. -- The board shall meet annually to
- 14 recommend to the department the awarding of grants to qualifying
- 15 <u>organizations.</u>
- 16 (c) Other meetings. -- The board shall meet at the call of the
- 17 chairperson to conduct business related to the award of grants.
- 18 <u>§ 10305</u>. Grants.
- 19 (a) General rule. -- The department shall make grants in an
- 20 amount not to exceed \$7,500 to qualifying agriculture and youth
- 21 organizations upon the recommendation of the board.
- 22 (b) Matching funds. -- Grants in an amount not to exceed
- 23 \$25,000 shall be awarded to qualifying agriculture and youth
- 24 organizations selected to receive the awards for the purposes of
- 25 capital projects. Grants for capital projects must be matched by
- 26 private money in an amount equal to the State grant.
- 27 <u>(c) Annual allocation.--The board shall establish annual</u>
- 28 allocation limits for each fiscal year.
- 29 <u>§ 10306</u>. Regulations.
- The department shall administer the provisions of this

- 1 chapter and, with the approval of the board, shall prescribe and
- 2 <u>adopt program policy quidelines or regulations to administer and</u>
- 3 <u>enforce this chapter. Until or unless supplanted by program</u>
- 4 policy guidelines or regulations adopted under this section, the
- 5 program guidelines promulgated under the act of August 6, 1991
- 6 (P.L.326, No.33), known as the Agriculture and Rural Youth
- 7 <u>Development Act, shall be the policy quidelines for the program.</u>
- 8 <u>§ 10307. Appropriation FUNDING.</u>
- 9 <u>(a) Specific appropriation. The sum of \$500,000, or as much</u> <--
- 10 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the department
- 11 for the 2019-2020 fiscal year to carry out the provisions of
- 12 this chapter. The appropriation under this subsection shall be a
- 13 continuing appropriation and shall not lapse at the end of the
- 14 fiscal year.
- 15 <u>(b) General rule.—</u>For purposes of implementing the
- 16 provisions of this chapter, the department may use:
- 17 (1) The appropriation described in subsection (a). <--
- 18 $\frac{(2)}{(1)}$ (1) Any other money appropriated by the General <--
- 19 Assembly to the department to carry out the provisions of
- this chapter.
- 21 $\frac{(3)}{(3)}$ (2) Any other money, contributions or payments which <--

- 23 Government or by any public or private source.
- 24 SECTION 2. REPEALS ARE AS FOLLOWS:
- 25 (1) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DECLARES THAT THE REPEAL UNDER
- 26 PARAGRAPH (2) IS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE ADDITION OF 3
- 27 PA.C.S. CH. 103.
- 28 (2) THE ACT OF AUGUST 6, 1991 (P.L.326, NO.33), KNOWN AS
- 29 THE AGRICULTURE AND RURAL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT ACT, IS REPEALED.
- 30 Section $\frac{2}{3}$. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
