AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An 1 act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and 2 brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and 3 changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 5 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 7 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 8 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," in 16 licenses and regulations relating to liquor, alcohol and malt 17 and brewed beverages, further providing for special occasion 18 19 permits. 20 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 21 hereby enacts as follows: 22 Section 1. Section 408.4(i) of the act of April 12, 1951 23 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, is amended to read: 24 Section 408.4. Special Occasion Permits .--25
- 26 (i) Only one special occasion permit shall be issued to each

- 1 eligible entity per calendar year. Each permit may only be used
- 2 for [six] <u>nine</u> consecutive or nonconsecutive days[; or] <u>and an</u>
- 3 <u>additional</u> ten consecutive days.

- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
