AN ACT

Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in grants to fire companies and emergency medical services companies, further providing for definitions, for establishment of Fire Company Grant Program and Emergency Medical Services Grant Program, for publication and notice, for award of grants, for consolidation incentive, 6 for Fire Company Grant Program, for Emergency Medical 7 Services Grant Program, for allocation of appropriated funds and for expiration of authority. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 11 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The definition of "agency" in section 7802 of 12 13 Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is repealed: § 7802. Definitions. 14 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter 15 16 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 17 context clearly indicates otherwise: 18 * * * 19 ["Agency." The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.] 20

- 1 Section 2. Sections 7811, 7812, 7813(a), (b), and (c), 7814,
- 2 7821, 7822, 7823(a) and (c), 7831, 7832, 7833 and 7841 of Title
- 3 35 are amended to read:
- 4 § 7811. Establishment.
- 5 The Fire Company Grant Program is established and shall be
- 6 administered by the [agency in consultation with the]
- 7 commissioner. Grants provided under this program shall be used
- 8 to improve and enhance the capabilities of the fire company to
- 9 provide firefighting, ambulance and rescue services.
- 10 § 7812. Publication and notice.
- 11 The [agency shall publish] commissioner shall transmit notice
- 12 of the grant program availability [through] to the Legislative
- 13 Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin:
- 14 (1) within 30 days of June 28, 2007, for the fiscal
- years beginning July 1, 2006, and July 1, 2007; and
- 16 (2) by August 8 for fiscal years beginning after June
- 17 30, 2008.
- 18 § 7813. Award of grants.
- 19 (a) Authorization. -- The [agency] commissioner is authorized
- 20 to make a grant award to each eligible fire company for the
- 21 following:
- 22 (1) Construction and renovation of the fire company's
- facility and purchase or repair of fixtures and furnishings
- 24 necessary to maintain or improve the capability of the
- company to provide fire, ambulance and rescue services.
- 26 (2) Repair of firefighting, ambulance or rescue
- 27 equipment or purchase thereof.
- 28 (3) Debt reduction associated with paragraph (1) or (2).
- 29 (4) Training and certification of members.
- 30 (5) Training and education of the general public

- 1 regarding fire prevention.
- 2 (6) Recruitment and retention.
- 3 * * *
- 4 (b) Limits.--
- 5 (1) Except as provided in [paragraph] paragraphs (1.1)
 6 and (3), grants shall be not less than \$2,500 and not more
 7 than \$15,000 per fire company.
- 8 (1.1) Grants shall be awarded to paid municipal fire
 9 companies based on the population, under the most recent
 10 Federal decennial census, of the municipality in which the
 11 fire company is located as follows:
- 12 Population Maximum Grant 13 Up to 20,000 \$25,000 14 From 20,001 to 40,000 \$50,000 15 From 40,001 to 60,000 \$75,000 From 60,001 to 80,000 16 \$100,000 17 From 80,001 to 100,000 \$125,000 18 From 100,001 to 200,000 <u>\$150,000</u> 19 From 200,001 to 900,000 \$400,000 20 Over 900,000 \$1,500,000
 - (2) Grants may be awarded on a pro rata basis if the total dollar amount of the approved application exceeds the amount of funds appropriated by the General Assembly for this purpose.
 - (3) In a municipality where there are two or more volunteer fire companies and if two or more volunteer fire companies consolidated their use of equipment, firefighters and services within 10 years preceding the date of the current year application submission deadline, the consolidated entity shall be deemed eligible to receive a

- 3 they not consolidated.
- 4 (c) Time for filing application and department action. --
- 5 (1) Within 30 days of June 28, 2007, for the fiscal
- 6 years beginning July 1, 2006, and July 1, 2007, and by
- 7 September 1 of each year thereafter, the [agency]
- 8 <u>commissioner</u> shall provide written instructions for grants
- 9 under this chapter to:
- 10 (i) except as set forth in subparagraph (ii), the
- 11 fire chief and president of every fire company; or
- 12 (ii) in the case of a municipal fire company, the
- 13 chief executive of the municipality.
- 14 (2) Within 45 days of June 28, 2007, for the fiscal
- years beginning July 1, 2006, and July 1, 2007, and by
- September 8 of each year thereafter, the [agency]
- 17 commissioner shall provide applications to individuals
- 18 specified in paragraph (1). The application for the fiscal
- 19 years commencing July 1, 2006, and July 1, 2007, shall be a
- 20 combined application. Fire companies seeking grants under
- 21 this chapter shall submit completed applications to the
- 22 [agency] <u>commissioner</u>. The application period shall remain
- open for 45 days each year. The [agency] <u>commissioner</u> shall
- 24 act to approve or disapprove applications within 60 days of
- 25 the application submission deadline each year. Applications
- which have not been approved or disapproved by the [agency]
- 27 <u>commissioner</u> within 60 days after the close of the
- application period each year shall be deemed approved.

- 30 § 7814. Consolidation incentive.

- 1 If, after July 31, 2003, two or more volunteer fire companies
- 2 consolidate their use of facilities, equipment, firefighters and
- 3 services, the consolidated entity may, upon notification of the
- 4 [agency] <u>commissioner</u>, be eligible for a reduction of the
- 5 interest rate payable on any outstanding principal balance owed,
- 6 as of the date of consolidation, by any or all of the
- 7 consolidating companies to the Volunteer Companies Loan Fund for
- 8 loans made under the act of July 15, 1976 (P.L.1036, No.208),
- 9 known as the Volunteer Fire Company, Ambulance Service and
- 10 Rescue Squad Assistance Act, or under Subchapter E of Chapter 73
- 11 (relating to volunteer fire company, ambulance service and
- 12 rescue squad assistance). The reduction in the interest rate
- 13 payable shall be from 2% to 1%. Upon receipt of such
- 14 notification, the [agency, in conjunction with the State Fire
- 15 Commissioner, commissioner shall determine and verify that the
- 16 consolidated entity is in fact a bona fide consolidated
- 17 volunteer fire company. If the [agency] <u>commissioner</u> determines
- 18 that the consolidated entity is a bona fide consolidated
- 19 volunteer fire company, it shall reduce the interest rate
- 20 payable on any outstanding principal balance owed to the
- 21 Volunteer Companies Loan Fund for loans made under the former
- 22 Volunteer Fire Company, Ambulance Service and Rescue Squad
- 23 Assistance Act, or under Subchapter E of Chapter 73, for which
- 24 the consolidating companies or the consolidated entity may be
- 25 individually or jointly responsible. The [agency] commissioner_
- 26 may promulgate such rules and regulations as may be necessary to
- 27 carry out the provisions of this section.
- 28 § 7821. Establishment.
- 29 The Emergency Medical Services Grant Program is established
- 30 and shall be administered by the [agency] <u>commissioner</u>. Grants

- 1 provided under this program shall be used to improve and enhance
- 2 the capabilities of EMS companies to provide ambulance,
- 3 emergency medical, basic life support and advanced life support
- 4 services.
- 5 § 7822. Publication and notice.
- 6 The [agency shall publish] <u>commissioner shall transmit</u> notice
- 7 of the grant program availability [through] to the Legislative
- 8 Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin:
- 9 (1) within 30 days of June 28, 2007, for the fiscal
- 10 years beginning July 1, 2006, and July 1, 2007; and
- 11 (2) by August 8 for fiscal years beginning after June
- 12 30, 2008.
- 13 § 7823. Award of grants.
- 14 (a) Authorization. -- The [agency] commissioner is authorized
- 15 to make a grant award to each eligible EMS company for the
- 16 following:
- 17 (1) Construction and renovation of the EMS company's
- 18 facility and purchase or repair of fixtures, furnishings,
- office equipment and support services necessary to maintain
- or improve the capability of the ambulance service to provide
- ambulance, emergency medical, basic life support and advanced
- 22 life support services.
- 23 (2) Repair of ambulance equipment or purchase thereof.
- 24 (3) Debt reduction associated with paragraph (1) or (2).
- 25 (4) Training and certification of members.
- 26 (5) Recruitment and retention.
- 27 * * *
- 28 (c) Time for filing application and department action. --
- 29 (1) Within 30 days of June 28, 2007, for the fiscal
- years commencing July 1, 2006, and July 1, 2007, and by

- 1 September 1 of each year thereafter, the [agency]
- 2 <u>commissioner</u> shall provide written instructions for grants
- 3 under this chapter to the president of every EMS company in
- 4 this Commonwealth.
- 5 (2) Within 45 days of the effective date of June 28,
- 6 2007, for the fiscal years commencing July 1, 2006, and July
- 7 1, 2007, and by September 8 of each year, the [agency]
- 8 <u>commissioner</u> shall provide applications to the president of
- 9 every EMS company. The application for the fiscal years
- 10 commencing July 1, 2006, and July 1, 2007, shall be a
- 11 combined application. EMS companies seeking grants under this
- chapter shall submit completed applications to the [agency]
- 13 <u>commissioner</u>. The application period shall remain open for 45
- days each year. The [agency] <u>commissioner</u> shall act to
- approve or disapprove applications within 60 days of the
- application submission deadline each year. Applications which
- have not been approved or disapproved by the [agency]
- 18 <u>commissioner</u> within 60 days after the close of the
- application period each year shall be deemed approved.
- 20 § 7831. Fire Company Grant Program.
- 21 The sum of [\$22,000,000] \$27,000,000 of the amount
- 22 appropriated to the [agency] <u>commissioner</u> for fire company
- 23 grants under section 1799-E of the act of April 9, 1929
- 24 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, shall be expended
- 25 for the purpose of making grants to eligible fire companies
- 26 under Subchapter B (relating to fire company grant program).
- 27 § 7832. Emergency Medical Services [Company] Grant Program.
- The sum of [\$3,000,000] \$6,750,000 of the amount appropriated
- 29 to the [agency] <u>commissioner</u> for EMS company grants under
- 30 section 1799-E of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176),

- 1 known as The Fiscal Code, shall be expended for the purpose of
- 2 making grants to eligible EMS companies under Subchapter C
- 3 (relating to emergency medical services grant program).
- 4 § 7833. Allocation of appropriated funds.
- 5 (a) Administration.--
- 6 (1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), no money
- 7 from the appropriation for grants shall be used for expenses
- 8 or costs incurred by the [agency] <u>commissioner</u> for the
- 9 administration of the grant programs authorized under
- 10 Subchapters B (relating to fire company grant program) and C
- 11 (relating to emergency medical services grant program).
- 12 (2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1), the commissioner may
- use not more than [\$800,000] \$1,000,000 of any unencumbered
- 14 funds remaining in the fund for administrative costs for
- grant program implementation under this chapter.
- 16 (b) Grant allocation. -- Unless otherwise expressly stated,
- 17 money appropriated to the [agency] commissioner for purposes of
- 18 company grants shall be allocated as follows:
- 19 (1) [Eighty-eight] The sum of \$200,000 from the amount
- 20 appropriated shall be expended for a single-point location in
- 21 the office of the commissioner for firefighter and emergency
- 22 medical services provider recruitment and retention.
- 23 (1.1) Eighty percent of the amount appropriated
- remaining after the expenditure under paragraph (1) shall be
- used for making grants to eligible fire companies under
- 26 Subchapter B.
- 27 (2) [Twelve] <u>Twenty</u> percent of the amount appropriated
- 28 remaining after the expenditure under paragraph (1) shall be
- 29 used for making grants to eligible EMS companies under
- 30 Subchapter C.

- 1 § 7841. Expiration of authority.
- 2 The authority of the [agency] <u>commissioner</u> to award grants
- 3 under Subchapters B (relating to fire company grant program) and
- 4 C (relating to emergency medical services grant program) shall
- 5 expire June 30, [2020] <u>2024</u>.
- 6 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
