AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for the Public School Building Emergency Repair and Renovation Grant Program; establishing the Public School Building Emergency Repair and Renovation Grant Fund; and making an appropriation.
9	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10	hereby enacts as follows:
11	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
12	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an
13	article to read:
14	ARTICLE VII-A
15	PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDING EMERGENCY REPAIR
16	AND RENOVATION GRANT PROGRAM
17	Section 701-A. Scope.
18	This article relates to the Public School Building Emergency

1	Repair and Renovation Grant Program.
2	<u>Section 702-A. Definitions.</u>
3	The following words and phrases when used in this article
4	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
5	context clearly indicates otherwise:
6	"Department." The Department of Education of the
7	Commonwealth.
8	"Eligible cost." The term includes the cost of all labor,
9	materials, necessary operational machinery and equipment, plans
10	and specifications, surveys, prefeasibility studies, engineering
11	and other professional services related to an emergency repair
12	and renovation project.
13	"Emergency repair and renovation projects." Eligible costs
14	associated with the improvement, repair, rehabilitation or
15	renovation of all or part of a public school building, which
16	include the following:
17	(1) Emergency repairs resulting from a natural or
18	<u>manmade disaster.</u>
19	(2) Lead abatement, remediation and removal.
20	(3) Asbestos abatement, remediation and removal.
21	(4) Heating, ventilation and air conditioning purchase,
22	repair or replacement.
23	(5) Electrical system repair or replacement.
24	(6) Roof and window repair or replacement.
25	(7) Plumbing repairs or replacement.
26	(8) Purchase, repair or replacement of indoor air
27	<u>quality systems.</u>
28	(9) Removal of the presence of toxins, chemicals and
29	health hazards, including mercury, radon, PCBs, mold, mildew,
30	rodents and pests.

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1	(10) Repairs or renovations that ensure the building
2	envelopes of public school buildings protect occupants and
3	interiors from the elements and are structurally sound and
4	secure.
5	(11) Repairs or renovations that ensure the safety of
6	drinking water and water used for meal preparation in public
7	school buildings, which may include testing of the potability
8	of water for the presence of lead and other contaminants.
9	(12) Repairs or renovations that bring public school
10	facilities into compliance with applicable fire, health and
11	<u>safety codes.</u>
12	(13) Other improvements, actions, repairs or renovations
13	that will improve the physical health, welfare and safety of
14	students as approved by the department.
15	"Fund." The Public School Building Emergency Repair and
16	Renovation Grant Fund established under section 704-A.
17	Section 703-A. Public School Building Emergency Repair and
18	Renovation Grant Program.
19	(a) EstablishmentThe Public School Building Emergency
20	Repair and Renovation Grant Program is established and shall be
21	administered by the department.
22	(b) ApplicationA school district may submit a single
23	application in writing to the department which identifies each
24	project for which grant funding is requested under this section.
25	The department may establish the form and manner in which an
26	application is submitted.
27	(c) Requirements of applicationAn application submitted
28	under subsection (b) shall include:
29	(1) A detailed plan of each emergency repair and
30	renovation project for which the school district is seeking
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1 <u>funding.</u>

2	(2) The total amount of grant funding requested.
3	(3) A statement indicating that the emergency repair and
4	renovation project is necessary to protect the health and
5	safety of the students in the school district.
6	(4) Any other information required by the department.
7	(d) ReviewWithin 30 days of receipt of an application,
8	the department shall review and approve or deny the application.
9	If the application is approved, the department shall award the
10	grant and execute a grant agreement with the school district. If
11	the application is denied, the department shall forward the
12	reasons for denial to the applicant and allow the applicant to
13	<pre>reapply.</pre>
14	Section 704-A. Public School Building Emergency Repair and
15	<u>Renovation Grant Fund.</u>
16	There is established in the State Treasury a special fund to
17	be known as the Public School Building Emergency Repair and
18	Renovation Grant Fund.
19	<u>Section 705-A. Use of money.</u>
20	(a) GrantsMoney in the fund may only be used for grants
21	to school districts for emergency repair and renovation projects
22	approved under section 703-A(d).
23	(b) DistributionMoney in the fund shall be distributed as
24	follows:
25	(1) The sum of \$85,000,000 shall be allocated for grants
26	for emergency repair and renovation projects in a school
27	<u>district of the first class.</u>
28	(2) The sum of \$30,000,000 shall be used for grants for
29	emergency repair and renovation projects in school districts,
30	except school districts of the first class, that are in one

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1	of the following categories:
2	(i) In financial recovery status under Subchapter C
3	of Article VI-A.
4	(ii) In financial watch status under Subchapter B of
5	Article VI-A.
6	(iii) With 20% or more of school-age children
7	identified as in acute poverty by the American Community
8	Survey data, as used in section 2502.53.
9	(3) The sum of \$10,000,000 shall be used for grants for
10	emergency repair and renovation projects in school districts
11	other than those identified in paragraphs (1) and (2).
12	(c) ProhibitionThe department may not award grants for
13	any of the following purposes:
14	(1) Construction of a new public school building.
15	(2) Payment of maintenance costs other than those
16	allowed in this article.
17	(3) Purchase, lease or upgrade of school district
18	vehicles.
19	(4) Improvement of a stand-alone facility which is not
20	used for the purpose of educating children, including
21	administrative or operations buildings or logistical support
22	facilities.
23	(d) GuidelinesThe department shall develop guidelines for
24	the following:
25	(1) Submitting applications for a grant.
26	(2) Reviewing applications and selecting projects for
27	the awarding of grants.
28	(3) Eligible uses of money by school districts that
29	<u>receive grants.</u>
30	(4) Minimum grant amounts.

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1 Section 706-A. Amount of grant.

2	Maximum grant amounts for a school district shall be as
3	<u>follows:</u>
4	(1) \$2,000,000 for school districts under section 705-
5	<u>A(b)(2).</u>
6	(2) \$500,000 for school districts under section 705-A(b)
7	<u>(3).</u>
8	Section 707-A. Deposit and transfer of money.
9	<u>For fiscal year 2019-2020, the sum of \$125,000,000 shall be</u>
10	deposited into the fund for purposes of awarding grants under
11	this article. Transfers to the fund shall be as follows:
12	(1) The sum of \$35,000,000 from the Surface Mining
13	Conservation and Reclamation Fund.
14	(2) The sum of \$10,000,000 from the trust account
15	established under 64 Pa.C.S. § 1541 (relating to trust
16	accounts) for the First Industries Program.
17	(3) The sum of \$20,000,000 from the trust account
18	established under 64 Pa.C.S. § 1541 for the New Pennsylvania
19	<u>Venture Capital Investment Program.</u>
20	(4) The sum of \$15,000,000 from the trust account
21	established under 64 Pa.C.S. § 1541 for the Building
22	<u>Pennsylvania Program.</u>
23	(5) The sum of \$45,000,000 from the Underground Storage
24	Tank Indemnification Fund.
25	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
