- 24 A REQUEST MAY BE SOLICITED OR UNSOLICITED AND MAY PROVIDE FOR
- 25 THE DEVELOPMENT OR OPERATION OF TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES OR
- 26 TRANSPORTATION-RELATED SERVICES USING A VARIETY OF PROJECT
- 27 DELIVERY METHODS AND FORMS OF AGREEMENT. THE METHODS MAY
- 28 INCLUDE:

- 19 ASSEMBLY THAT THE COMMONWEALTH, AND ITS OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES,
- 20 A COUNTY AND ITS OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES, A CITY OF THE FIRST
- 21 CLASS AND ITS OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES, A CITY OF THE SECOND
