## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in children and youth,
- 4 providing for Statewide children's mental health ombudsman.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 8 as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a section to
- 9 read:
- 10 Section 710. Statewide Children's Mental Health Ombudsman.--
- 11 (a) The secretary, subject to appropriation or the receipt of
- 12 Federal funds, shall establish a Statewide children's mental
- 13 health ombudsman for the following purposes:
- 14 (1) Advocating on behalf of children with mental health
- 15 disorders.
- 16 (2) Identifying barriers to effective mental health
- 17 <u>treatment and proposed solutions.</u>
- 18 (3) Monitoring and ensuring compliance with relevant

- 1 statutes, regulations, rules and policies pertaining to
- 2 <u>children's behavioral health services.</u>
- 3 (4) Receiving, investigating and resolving through
- 4 <u>administrative action</u>, as described under subsection (d),
- 5 complaints filed by a child or by individuals legally authorized
- 6 to act on behalf of the child, or by an individual, organization
- 7 or government agency that has reason to believe that an entity
- 8 regulated by the Commonwealth has engaged in activities,
- 9 practices or omissions that constitute violations of applicable
- 10 court orders, statutes or regulations or that may have an
- 11 adverse effect upon the health, safety, welfare or rights of
- 12 <u>children.</u>
- (b) Within sixty days of the appropriation or receipt of
- 14 Federal funds required under subsection (a), the secretary shall
- 15 designate an individual to act as the ombudsman who shall be
- 16 qualified by training and experience to perform the duties of
- 17 the ombudsman.
- 18 (c) The ombudsman shall serve for a term of five years and
- 19 shall continue to hold office until a successor is appointed.
- 20 the secretary may reappoint the ombudsman for one additional
- 21 term. The secretary may remove the ombudsman only for neglect of
- 22 duty, misconduct or inability to perform duties.
- 23 (d) The secretary, in consultation with the ombudsman, the
- 24 Deputy Secretary for Medical Assistance Programs and the
- 25 Director of the Bureau of Children's Behavioral Health Services,
- 26 shall establish policies and procedures to facilitate the
- 27 purposes of the ombudsman. The policies and procedures shall
- 28 include procedures for filing complaints, investigating
- 29 complaints and taking action to implement resolutions to
- 30 complaints, including the use of State agency enforcement

- 1 authority to resolve complaints as recommended by the ombudsman.
- 2 (e) In ensuring that the goals of the ombudsman are met, the
- 3 following shall apply:
- 4 (1) The ombudsman shall monitor the development and
- 5 implementation of Federal, State and local statutes, regulations
- 6 and policies regarding services and supports for children with
- 7 mental health disorders, including the education of children
- 8 with mental health disorders.
- 9 (2) The ombudsman shall maintain complete records of
- 10 complaints received, the actions taken, findings, outcomes and
- 11 recommendations in response to any complaints and other actions,
- 12 <u>including those taken by the Commonwealth and private agency</u>
- 13 <u>responses to serious complaints.</u>
- 14 (3) Each quarter, the ombudsman shall send a report to each
- 15 government agency about which a complaint was received by the
- 16 ombudsman during the relevant period, listing the complaints
- 17 involving that agency which were received during the past
- 18 guarter, and shall meet regularly with the secretary, the Deputy
- 19 Secretary for Medical Assistance Programs and the Director of
- 20 the Bureau of Children's Behavioral Health Services and shall
- 21 report on any Statewide problems that the ombudsman has
- 22 identified and potential solutions.
- 23 (4) The ombudsman shall report annually, within one hundred
- 24 twenty days of the end of the fiscal year, to the Governor, the
- 25 President pro tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
- 26 Representatives, the Majority Chairman and the Minority Chairman
- 27 of the Aging and Youth Committee of the Senate, the Majority
- 28 Chairman and the Minority Chairman of the Children and Youth
- 29 Committee of the House of Representatives, the Majority Chairman
- 30 and the Minority Chairman of the Education Committee of the

- 1 Senate, the Majority Chairman and Minority Chairman of the
- 2 Education Committee of the House of Representatives, the
- 3 Majority Chairman and the Minority Chairman of the Health and
- 4 <u>Human Services Committee of the Senate, the Majority Chairman</u>
- 5 and the Minority Chairman of the Health Committee of the House
- 6 of Representatives and the Majority Chairman and the Minority
- 7 Chairman of the Human Services Committee of the House of
- 8 Representatives, on the activities of the children's mental
- 9 health ombudsman, including complaints that are relevant to the
- 10 ombudsman and an analysis of patterns in complaints made through
- 11 the ombudsman and shall make recommendations for legislation,
- 12 policy or programmatic changes related to the protection of the
- 13 rights of children with mental health disorders. The report
- 14 shall be made available to the public and published on the
- 15 department's publicly accessible Internet website.
- 16 (f) The department shall promulgate regulations necessary
- 17 for the implementation of this section.
- 18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.

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
