## AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An 1 act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public 2 welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in departmental powers and 3 duties as to licensing, further providing for regulations. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 1021(a)(2) of the act of June 13, 1967 7 8 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, is amended and the paragraph is amended by adding subparagraphs to read: Section 1021. Regulations. -- (a) \* \* \* 10 11 Regulations for assisted living residences, which shall 12 apply to all staff, administration and persons contracted by the assisted living residence to deliver care, shall: 13 \* \* \* 14 15 (ix) Provide the following rights to residents: 16 (A) A resident may not be discriminated against because of
- 18 orientation, gender identity, national origin, age or sex.

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race, color, religious creed, disability, ancestry, sexual

- 1 (B) A resident may not be neglected, intimidated, physically
- 2 or verbally abused, mistreated, subjected to corporal punishment
- 3 or disciplined in any way. A resident shall be free from mental,
- 4 physical and sexual abuse and exploitation, neglect, financial
- 5 <u>exploitation and involuntary seclusion.</u>
- 6 (C) A resident shall be treated with dignity and respect.
- 7 (D) A resident shall be informed of the rules of the
- 8 <u>assisted living residence and given 30 days' written notice</u>
- 9 prior to the effective date of a new rule.
- 10 (E) A resident shall have access to a telephone in the
- 11 assisted living residence to make calls in privacy. Nontoll
- 12 calls shall be without charge to the resident.
- (F) A resident has the right to receive and send mail. The
- 14 following shall apply:
- 15 (I) Outgoing mail may not be opened or read by assisted
- 16 <u>living residence staff unless upon request of the resident.</u>
- 17 (II) Incoming mail may not be opened or read by assisted
- 18 living residence staff unless upon request of the resident or
- 19 the resident's personal representative or other individual upon
- 20 the resident's written approval.
- 21 (G) A resident has the right to communicate privately with
- 22 and access the local ombudsman.
- 23 (H) A resident has the right to practice the religion or
- 24 faith of the resident's choice, or not to practice any religion
- 25 or faith.
- 26 (I) A resident shall receive assistance in accessing health
- 27 care services, including supplemental health care services.
- 28 (J) A resident shall receive assistance in obtaining and
- 29 keeping clean, seasonal clothing. A resident's clothing may not
- 30 be shared with other residents.

- 1 (K) A resident, the resident's personal representative and
- 2 <u>other individuals upon the resident's written approval shall</u>
- 3 have the right to access, review and request corrections to the
- 4 resident's record on file with the assisted living residence.
- 5 (L) A resident has the right to furnish the resident's
- 6 <u>living unit and purchase</u>, receive, use and retain personal
- 7 <u>clothing and possessions.</u>
- 8 (M) A resident has the right to leave and return to the
- 9 assisted living residence at times consistent with the assisted
- 10 living residence rules and the resident's support plan. Any
- 11 <u>individual appointed by the resident, including the resident's</u>
- 12 personal representative, may place or remove the resident
- 13 according to the resident's support plan.
- 14 (N) A resident has the right to relocate and to request and
- 15 receive assistance, from the assisted living residence, in
- 16 relocating to another facility. The assistance shall include
- 17 helping the resident get information about living arrangements,
- 18 making telephone calls and transferring records.
- 19 (O) A resident has the right to freely associate, organize
- 20 and communicate privately with the resident's friends, family,
- 21 physician, attorney and other persons.
- 22 (P) A resident shall be free from restraints.
- 23 (O) A resident shall be compensated in accordance with
- 24 Federal and State labor laws for labor performed on behalf of
- 25 the assisted living residence. A resident may voluntarily and
- 26 without coercion perform tasks related directly to the
- 27 <u>resident's personal space or common areas of the assisted living</u>
- 28 residence.
- 29 (R) A resident has the right to receive visitors at any time
- 30 provided that the visits do not adversely affect other

- 1 residents. An assisted living residence may adopt reasonable
- 2 policies and procedures related to visitors and access. If the
- 3 <u>assisted living residence adopts such policies and procedures,</u>
- 4 the policies and procedures shall be binding on all residents.
- 5 (S) A resident has the right to privacy of self and
- 6 possessions. Privacy shall be provided to the resident during
- 7 bathing, dressing, changing and medical procedures.
- 8 (T) A resident has the right to file complaints, grievances
- 9 or appeals with any individual or agency and recommend changes
- 10 in policies, residence rules and services of the residence
- 11 without intimidation, retaliation or threat of discharge.
- 12 (U) A resident has the right to remain in the assisted
- 13 living residence, as long as it is operating with a license,
- 14 except as specified in 55 Pa. Code § 2800.228 (relating to
- 15 transfer and discharge).
- 16 (V) A resident has the right to receive services contracted
- 17 for in the resident's contract with the assisted living
- 18 residence.
- 19 (W) A resident has the right to use both the assisted living
- 20 residence's procedures and external procedures to appeal
- 21 involuntary discharge.
- 22 (X) A resident has the right to a system to safeguard the
- 23 <u>resident's money and personal property.</u>
- 24 (Y) An assisted living residence may require a resident to
- 25 <u>use providers of supplemental health care services as provided</u>
- 26 under 55 Pa. Code § 2800.142 (relating to assistance with
- 27 <u>medical care and supplemental health care services). When the</u>
- 28 assisted living residence does not designate a supplemental
- 29 <u>health care service provider, the resident may choose the</u>
- 30 supplemental health care service provider. The actions and

- 1 procedures utilized by a supplemental health care service
- 2 provider chosen by a resident shall be consistent with the
- 3 assisted living residence's systems for caring for residents,
- 4 which include the handling and assisting with the administration
- 5 of the resident's medications, and may not conflict with Federal
- 6 <u>laws governing residents.</u>
- 7 (Z) The resident has the right to choose the resident's
- 8 primary care physician.
- 9 (AA) The resident has the right to have publicly posted the
- 10 telephone numbers and addresses for the department's assisted
- 11 <u>living residence licensing office</u>, <u>local ombudsman or protective</u>
- 12 <u>services unit in the area agency on aging, the Disability Rights</u>
- 13 <u>Network or law enforcement agency.</u>
- 14 (BB) The resident has the right to make choices concerning
- 15 the resident's daily life in the assisted living residence.
- 16 (CC) The resident has the right to be protected from
- 17 involuntary transfers, discharges and evictions in violation of
- 18 State law and regulation.
- 19 (DD) The resident has the right to receive written
- 20 information on the right to establish an advanced health care
- 21 directive.
- 22 (EE) The resident has the right to receive written notice of
- 23 any room changes at least thirty days in advance unless the
- 24 request for a change is agreed to by the resident, required to
- 25 <u>fill a vacant bed, or necessary due to an emergency.</u>
- 26 (FF) The resident has the right to reasonable accommodation
- 27 <u>of individual needs and preferences in all aspects of life in</u>
- 28 the assisted living residence, except when the health or safety
- 29 of the individual or other residents would be endangered.
- 30 (GG) The resident has the right to reasonable accommodation

- 1 of resident preferences concerning room and roommate choices.
- 2 (HH) A resident may not be subject to unequal, unfair or
- 3 inflated pricing for living arrangements, amenities and
- 4 applications based on race, color, religious creed, disability,
- 5 <u>ancestry</u>, <u>sexual orientation</u>, <u>gender identity</u>, <u>national origin</u>,
- 6 <u>age or sex.</u>
- 7 (x) Definition. -- As used in this paragraph, the term
- 8 "personal representative" means an executor or administrator of
- 9 any description appointed by the resident in writing which shall
- 10 be kept on file by the assisted living residence.

- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
