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1 Appropriation Act of 2020.

2 Section 102. Definitions.

3 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 4 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 5 context clearly indicates otherwise:

6 "Current fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1,7 2020, and ending June 30, 2021.

8 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau 9 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant 10 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, 11 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, 12 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians, 13 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and 14 other assistants in a department, board or commission.

15 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding 16 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, 17 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and 18 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage,

19 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll 20 charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water, 21 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of 22 23 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and 24 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums 25 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on 26 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee 27 28 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance, 29 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and 30 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the

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purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery 1 2 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment 3 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for 4 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of 5 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term 6 7 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the 8 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case 9 10 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that 11 provided under the State medical assistance program.

12 "Prior fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1 of the 13 fiscal year immediately prior to the current fiscal year.

4 Section 104. State appropriations.

5 (a) General Fund.--Except as provided in Part XIX, the sums 6 specified in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated from the General Fund to agencies 7 8 of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 9 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 10 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or 11 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 12 13 purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public 14 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and 15 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by 16 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes specified 17 18 in this act for the current fiscal year and for the payment of 19 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior 20 fiscal year.

Special funds and accounts.--Except as provided in Part 21 (b) XIX, the sums specified in this act, or as much thereof as may 22 23 be necessary, are specifically appropriated from the special 24 funds and accounts in the State Treasury to agencies of the 25 Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the 26 payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the 27 28 Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services 29 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this 30

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act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions
 and activities and for the purposes specified in this act for
 the current fiscal year and for the payment of bills incurred
 and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior fiscal year.

6 Except as otherwise provided in section 1902, the Federal 7 appropriations specified in this act, or as much thereof as may 8 be necessary, are specifically appropriated to the agencies of 9 the Executive Department of the Commonwealth specified in this 10 act for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs specified in this act for the current fiscal 11 12 year and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 13 at the close of the prior fiscal year.
