AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 17 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," providing for emergency COVID-19 provisions. 21 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 23 hereby enacts as follows: 24 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known

3	ARTICLE I-A
4	EMERGENCY COVID-19 PROVISIONS
5	Section 101 A. Extension of waiver provisions.
6	(a) General rule. The Secretary of Community and Economic_
7	<u>Development shall immediately issue a waiver to the Governor's</u>
8	20200319 TWW COVID 19 Business Closure Order to all vehicle
9	dealer activities that can adhere to the social distancing
10	practices and other mitigation measures defined by the Centers
11	for Disease Control to protect workers and to mitigate the
12	<u>spread of the COVID 19 virus.</u>
13	(b) Required protection for employees. All businesses that
14	receive a waiver and operate under subsection (a) shall also
15	provide, at minimum, the following protections for an essential
16	<u>employee:</u>
17	(1) Additional hazard pay, relative to the employee's
18	<u>risk of exposure.</u>
19	(2) Appropriate new personal protective equipment at the
20	start of every shift. Personal protective equipment shall
21	include, but not be limited to, gloves and a mask.
22	(3) A work environment that maximizes the safety of the
23	employee and the public, including, but not limited to,
24	social distancing and barriers.
25	(4) Cleaning areas with adequate soap and water and
26	breaks to frequently engage in hand washing.
27	(5) Leave for sickness, which shall be compensated at
28	the employee's normal wage.
29	(6) Information by the business if a coworker has been
30	tested for COVID-19 and the results of those tests when

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1	<u>available.</u>
2	(c) Violation. A business operating in this Commonwealth
3	under a waiver under subsection (a) that violates any
4	requirement under subsection (b) shall be immediately closed and
5	may not be permitted to reopen until the business is in
6	<u>compliance.</u>
7	(d) Definitions. The following words and phrases when used
8	in this section shall have the meanings given to them in this
9	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
10	"Essential employee." An employee of a business who is
11	required by the employee's employer to report to work at a
12	physical location.

23	SECTION 102-A. VEHICLE DEALER WAIVER PROVISIONS.
24	(A) WAIVERTHE SECRETARY SHALL IMMEDIATELY ISSUE A WAIVER
25	TO THE ORDER TO ALL DEALERS OR OTHER VEHICLE-RELATED BUSINESSES
26	THAT COMPLY WITH SECTION 108-A.
27	(B) DEFINITIONSAS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE TERM "DEALER"
28	<u>SHALL HAVE THE SAME MEANING AS PROVIDED IN 75 PA.C.S. § 102</u>
29	(RELATING TO DEFINITIONS).
30	SECTION 103-A. LAWN AND GARDEN CENTERS WAIVER PROVISIONS.

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1	THE SECRETARY SHALL IMMEDIATELY ISSUE A WAIVER TO THE ORDER
2	TO ALL LAWN AND GARDEN EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES STORES THAT COMPLY
3	WITH SECTION 108-A.
4	SECTION 104-A. COSMETOLOGY SALON AND BARBER SHOP WAIVER
5	PROVISIONS.
6	(A) WAIVERTHE SECRETARY SHALL IMMEDIATELY ISSUE A WAIVER
7	TO THE ORDER TO ALLOW:
8	(1) ALL ACTIVITIES BY LICENSED BARBERS AS DEFINED UNDER
9	SECTION 2.1 OF THE ACT OF JUNE 19, 1931 (P.L.589, NO.202),
10	REFERRED TO AS THE BARBERS' LICENSE LAW; AND
11	(2) ALL ACTIVITIES PERTAINING TO THE EMBELLISHMENT,
12	CLEANLINESS AND BEAUTIFICATION OF THE HUMAN HAIR BY LICENSED
13	COSMETOLOGISTS AS DEFINED UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE ACT OF MAY
14	3, 1933 (P.L.242, NO.86), REFERRED TO AS THE COSMETOLOGY LAW.
15	(B) MITIGATION MEASURESWAIVERS UNDER SUBSECTION (A) SHALL
16	ONLY BE ISSUED TO BUSINESS ACTIVITIES THAT CAN DO ALL OF THE
17	FOLLOWING TO PROTECT WORKERS AND CUSTOMERS FROM AND MITIGATE THE
18	SPREAD OF COVID-19:
19	(1) COMPLY WITH APPLICABLE MITIGATION MEASURES DEFINED
20	BY THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ADMINISTRATION AND THE
21	DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND ADDITIONAL MEASURES PRESCRIBED BY
22	THE STATE BOARD OF BARBER EXAMINERS AND THE STATE BOARD OF
23	COSMETOLOGY;
24	(2) REQUIRE THAT EMPLOYEES WEAR MASKS AND GLOVES AT ALL
25	TIMES;
26	(3) SERVE CUSTOMERS BY APPOINTMENT ONLY TO ENSURE THE
27	LOWEST POSSIBLE AMOUNT OF CUSTOMERS AND EMPLOYEES AT A TIME
28	IN ORDER TO COMPLY WITH SOCIAL DISTANCING GUIDELINES;
29	(4) REQUIRE CUSTOMERS TO EITHER WASH HANDS WITH SOAP AND
30	WATER OR HAND SANITIZER UPON ENTERING UNLESS WEARING GLOVES;
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1	(5) ENSURE THAT CUSTOMERS WEAR MASKS AT ALL TIMES AND
2	MAINTAIN AT LEAST SIX FEET OF DISTANCE BETWEEN OTHER
3	CUSTOMERS;
4	(6) REMOVE ALL READING AND OTHER MATERIALS FROM WAITING
5	AREAS BESIDE SEATING FOR CUSTOMERS;
6	(7) PROHIBIT INDIVIDUALS ON THE PREMISES WITHOUT AN
7	APPOINTMENT UNLESS ACCOMPANYING A CUSTOMER UNDER THE AGE OF
8	<u>18; AND</u>
9	(8) WIPE DOWN CHAIRS, SURFACES AND OTHER EQUIPMENT USED
10	ON A CUSTOMER WITH ACCEPTABLE CLEANING MATERIALS AFTER EVERY
11	CUSTOMER.
12	SECTION 105-A. MESSENGER SERVICE AND AGENT SERVICE ACTIVITIES
13	WAIVER PROVISIONS.
14	(A) WAIVERTHE SECRETARY SHALL IMMEDIATELY ISSUE A WAIVER
15	TO THE ORDER TO MESSENGER SERVICE AND AGENT SERVICE ACTIVITIES
16	THAT COMPLY WITH SECTION 108-A.
17	(B) DEFINITIONSAS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE TERMS
18	"MESSENGER SERVICE" AND "AGENT SERVICE" SHALL HAVE THE SAME
19	MEANING AS PROVIDED IN 75 PA.C.S. § 102 (RELATING TO
20	DEFINITIONS).
21	SECTION 106-A. ANIMAL GROOMING SERVICES WAIVER PROVISIONS.
22	THE SECRETARY SHALL IMMEDIATELY ISSUE A WAIVER TO THE ORDER
23	TO ANIMAL GROOMING SERVICES THAT COMPLY WITH SECTION 108-A.
24	SECTION 107-A. MANUFACTURING OPERATIONS WAIVER PROVISIONS.
25	(A) WAIVERTHE SECRETARY SHALL IMMEDIATELY ISSUE A WAIVER
26	TO THE ORDER TO ALL MANUFACTURING OPERATIONS THAT COMPLY WITH
27	SECTION 108-A.
28	(B) DEFINITIONAS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE TERM
29	"MANUFACTURING OPERATIONS" SHALL INCLUDE THE PERFORMANCE AS A
30	BUSINESS OF AN INTEGRATED SERIES OF OPERATIONS WHICH PLACES
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1	PERSONAL PROPERTY IN A FORM, COMPOSITION OR CHARACTER DIFFERENT
2	FROM THAT IN WHICH IT WAS ACQUIRED WHETHER FOR SALE OR USE BY
3	THE MANUFACTURER BEGINNING WITH THE FIRST PRODUCTION OPERATION
4	AND ENDING WITH THE PACKAGING OF THE PRODUCT FOR THE ULTIMATE
5	CONSUMER.
6	SECTION 108-A. COMPLIANCE.
7	A BUSINESS SHALL ADHERE TO SOCIAL DISTANCING PRACTICES AND
8	OTHER MITIGATION MEASURES DEFINED BY THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE
9	CONTROL AND PREVENTION TO PROTECT WORKERS AND TO MITIGATE THE
10	SPREAD OF THE COVID-19 VIRUS AND THE ORDER OF THE SECRETARY OF
11	HEALTH DIRECTING PUBLIC HEALTH SAFETY MEASURES FOR BUSINESSES
12	PERMITTED TO MAINTAIN IN-PERSON OPERATIONS.
13	SECTION 109-A. EFFECT OF SUBSEQUENT ORDERS.
14	A WAIVER GRANTED UNDER THIS ARTICLE SHALL REMAIN VALID
15	NOTWITHSTANDING ANY ORDER ISSUED PURSUANT TO THE DECLARATION OF
16	DISASTER EMERGENCY ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR ON MARCH 6, 2020,
17	PUBLISHED AT 50 PA.B. 1644 (MARCH 21, 2020), OR ANY RENEWAL OF
18	THE DECLARATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY, UNLESS THE ORDER REMOVES
19	ANY OF THE RESTRICTIONS OR OTHERWISE GRANTS GREATER PERMISSIONS
20	FOR OPERATIONS THAN ARE PROVIDED UNDER THIS ARTICLE.
21	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
