1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for associate degree for transfer programs.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an
11	article to read:
12	ARTICLE XIX-I
13	ASSOCIATE DEGREE FOR TRANSFER PROGRAMS
14	Section 1901-I. Scope of article.
15	This article relates to associate degree for transfer
16	programs.
17	Section 1902-I. Definitions.
18	The following words and phrases when used in this article

1 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
2 context clearly indicates otherwise:
3 <u>"Community college." A community college under Article XIX-</u>
4 <u>A.</u>
5 "Institution." As defined under section 2001-A.
6 <u>Section 1903-I. Associate degree for transfer programs.</u>
7 (a) General ruleBeginning with the fall term of the 2021-
8 2022 academic year, a student who earns an associate degree for
9 <u>transfer granted under subsection (b) shall be eligible for</u>
10 transfer into a baccalaureate program at an institution when the
11 student meets both of the following requirements:
12 (1) Completion of 60 semester credit hours that are
13 <u>eligible for transfer to an institution, including both of</u>
14 <u>the following:</u>
15 (i) The community college's general education
16 <u>requirements.</u>
17 (ii) A minimum of 18 semester credit hours in a
18 <u>major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community</u>
19 <u>college.</u>
20 (2) Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0.
21 (b) Associate degree for transferA community college
22 <u>shall develop a program and grant associate degrees for transfer</u>
23 to students that meet the requirements under subsection (a).
24 (c) ProhibitionA community college may not impose any
25 requirements in addition to the requirements under this section
26 for a student to be eligible for the associate degree for
27 transfer and subsequent admission to an institution.
28 (d) CollaborationA community college may consider the
29 articulation agreements and other agreements between the
30 respective faculties from the affected community college and
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institution campuses in implementing the requirements of this 1 2 section. 3 (e) Credits earned at other community college.--A community college may accept credits earned at other community colleges 4 toward the associate degree for transfer under this section. 5 Section 1904-I. Admission to institution. 6 7 (a) General rule. -- An institution shall guarantee admission 8 with junior status to any community college student who is granted an associate degree for transfer under section 1903-I. 9 10 (b) Specific majors and campuses. -- Admission to an institution does not quarantee admission for a specific major or 11 12 campus. An institution shall grant a student priority admission 13 to a campus near the student's residence and to a program or 14 major that is similar to the student's community college major or program area of emphasis, as determined by the institution 15 16 campus to which the student is admitted. 17 (c) Priority.--A student admitted under this article shall 18 receive priority over all other community college transfer 19 students, excluding community college students who have entered into a transfer agreement between a community college and an 20 institution prior to the effective date of this section. 21 22 (d) Admissions redirection process. -- An institution shall 23 develop an admissions redirection process for a student admitted 24 under this article who applies for admission to the institution but is not accepted into the institution's campus to which the 25 26 student applied. Section 1905-I. Transfer process. 27 28 (a) Additional courses. -- An institution may require a 29 student transferring under this article to take additional courses at the institution so long as the student is not 30

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1	required to take any more than 60 additional semester credit
2	hours at the institution for majors requiring 120 semester
3	credit hours. Specified majors may be exempt from this
4	subsection upon agreement by the Board of Governors of the State
5	System of Higher Education and a community college.
6	(b) Applicability of creditsCommunity college transfer
7	credit hours shall not be applicable to upper division
8	requirements at the institution, unless agreed upon by the
9	institution and a community college and the transferred credit
10	hours do not exceed the required 60 semester credit hours
11	required under subsection (a).
12	<u>(c) Similar coursesAn institution may not require a</u>
13	student transferring under this article to repeat courses that
14	are similar to those taken at the community college that counted
15	toward the associate degree for transfer granted under this
16	<u>article.</u>
17	Section 1906-I. Report.
18	(a) General ruleAt the end of the 2021-2022 academic
19	year, the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee shall review
20	and provide a report with an update on the implementation of
21	this article to the following:
22	(1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
23	Education Committee of the Senate.
24	(2) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
25	Education Committee of the House of Representatives.
26	(3) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
27	Finance Committee of the Senate.
28	(4) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
29	Finance Committee of the House of Representatives.
30	(b) Contents of reportThe report under subsection (a)

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1 <u>shall include the following:</u>

2	(1) The outcomes of implementation of this article,
3	including, but not limited to, the following:
4	(i) The number and percentage of community college
5	students who earned an associate degree for transfer and
6	transferred to an institution under this article.
7	(ii) The average number of semester credit hours it
8	takes a community college student earning an associate
9	degree for transfer under this article to transfer to and
10	graduate from an institution, as compared to the average
11	number of semester credit hours it took community college
12	transfer students prior to enactment of this article, and
13	compared to students using other transfer processes
14	<u>available.</u>
15	(iii) Student progression and completion rates.
16	(iv) Other relevant indicators of student success.
17	(v) The degree to which the requirements for an
18	associate degree for transfer take into account existing
19	articulation agreements and the degree to which community
20	colleges facilitate the acceptance of credits between
21	community colleges.
22	(vi) The degree to which institutions were able to
23	accommodate students admitted under this article to a
24	campus of their choice and a major that is similar to the
25	student's community college major.
26	(2) Recommendations for statutory changes necessary to
27	facilitate the goal of a clear and transparent transfer
28	process.
29	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
