AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the COVID-19 Mitigation Grant Program for small businesses.
- 3 Section 1. Short title.
- 4 This act shall be known and may be cited as the COVID-19
- 5 Mitigation Grants for Small Businesses Act.
- 6 Section 2. Definitions.
- 7 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 8 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 9 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 10 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic
- 11 Development of the Commonwealth.
- 12 "Disaster emergency." The proclamation of disaster emergency
- 13 issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B.
- 14 1644 (March 21, 2020), and any renewal of the state of disaster
- 15 emergency.
- 16 "Grant." A grant awarded under the COVID-19 Mitigation Grant

- 1 Program.
- 2 "Program." The COVID-19 Mitigation Grant Program.
- 3 "Secretary." The Secretary of Community and Economic
- 4 Development of the Commonwealth.
- 5 "Small business." A retail or personal service employer
- 6 within this Commonwealth:
- 7 (1) whose gross annual receipts for the prior fiscal
- 8 year did not exceed \$1,500,000; or
- 9 (2) that employs no more than 10 full-time employees.
- 10 Section 3. COVID-19 Mitigation Grant Program.
- 11 (a) Establishment.--The COVID-19 Mitigation Grant Program is
- 12 established in the department to provide grants to small
- 13 businesses for mitigation efforts to prevent the spread of
- 14 COVID-19.
- 15 (b) Use of grant money. -- Grant money awarded by the
- 16 department shall be used by the small business to follow health
- 17 and safety guidelines established by the department or the
- 18 Department of Health and to implement COVID-19 mitigation
- 19 efforts to protect its employees and customers, including all of
- 20 the following:
- 21 (1) Contactless payment methods.
- 22 (2) Protective barriers.
- 23 (3) Personal protective equipment for employees and
- customers.
- 25 (4) Other mitigation efforts approved by the department.
- 26 (c) Amount. -- Subject to the availability of program funds, a
- 27 a small business that meets the requirements under section 4 may
- 28 be awarded a one-time grant not exceed \$15,000.
- 29 Section 4. Eligibility.
- 30 A small business is eligible for a grant if it meets the

- 1 following requirements:
- 2 (1) has been financially harmed by the COVID-19
- 3 pandemic; and
- 4 (2) any of the following:
- 5 (i) is deemed life-sustaining by the Commonwealth;
- 6 (ii) is granted a waiver to operate during the
- 7 disaster emergency; or
- 8 (iii) operates in a county that has been designated
- 9 by executive action to be in the Yellow Phase or Green
- 10 Phase.
- 11 Section 5. Application.
- 12 (a) Development of application. -- The department shall create
- 13 and implement an application for small businesses applying for
- 14 the program.
- 15 (b) Contents of application. -- The application shall include
- 16 all of the following information:
- 17 (1) The name, address and contact information for the
- 18 small business.
- 19 (2) The amount of grant money requested.
- 20 (3) The intended use of the grant money and any
- 21 mitigation efforts the small business plans to undertake.
- 22 (4) The financial impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and
- the disaster emergency on the small business.
- 24 (5) Any other information deemed necessary by the
- department.
- 26 Section 6. Public notice.
- 27 The department shall provide information regarding the
- 28 application for the program and award of grant money on its
- 29 publicly accessible Internet website.
- 30 Section 7. Appropriation.

- 1 The sum of \$50,000,000 is appropriated from the CARES Act
- 2 Fund to the department to administer the program.
- 3 Section 8. Reporting.
- 4 Following the termination or expiration of the disaster
- 5 emergency, the department shall post on its publicly accessible
- 6 Internet website the recipients of grants and the amount of
- 7 grant money awarded.
- 8 Section 9. Guidelines.
- 9 The department may implement guidelines for the
- 10 administration of this act.
- 11 Section 10. Expiration.
- 12 This act shall expire three months after the disaster
- 13 emergency has been rescinded.
- 14 Section 11. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 30 days.
