A RESOLUTION

- Paying tribute to those who lost their lives during the terrorist attack at the mosques in Christchurch, New Zealand.
- WHEREAS, At approximately 1:40 p.m. on Friday, March 15,
- 4 2019, a gunman entered a Christchurch, New Zealand city mosque
- 5 with an automatic weapon and opened fire on people inside during
- 6 Jumu'ah prayer; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The gunman then proceeded to a second mosque and
- 8 continued on his murderous rampage; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The gunman shot and killed a total of 50 people and
- 10 seriously injured 50 others; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The attack is New Zealand's worst terror attack,
- 12 deadliest mass shooting and incident of violence against the
- 13 Muslim community in its history; and
- 14 WHEREAS, New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern described
- 15 the horror as a terrorist attack, saying it was perpetrated by

- 1 suspects with "extremist views" that had no place in her country
- 2 or the wider world; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Stories of the bravery of those inside the mosques
- 4 have revealed that some acted as heroes in an attempt to shield
- 5 family members and fellow worshipers, with one worshiper
- 6 actually chasing the gunman away from the first mosque, thus
- 7 preventing further loss of life; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The terrorist attack appeared to have been carried
- 9 out by a white nationalist who posted a racist manifesto online
- 10 and streamed live video of the killings; and
- 11 WHEREAS, A 28-year-old man from Australia was charged with
- 12 murder, and New Zealand police have said he would face
- 13 additional charges and were considering charging him under the
- 14 country's Terrorism Suppression Act 2002; and
- WHEREAS, With an immense outpouring of support from all over
- 16 the world, people have shown they value the lives and
- 17 contributions of those of all religions and advocate love and
- 18 acceptance over hate and ignorance; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of
- 20 Pennsylvania denounces the killing of innocent people and the
- 21 use of violence to express hate and inflict terror; therefore be
- 22 it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 24 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania pay tribute to those who lost their
- 25 lives during the terrorist attack at the mosques in
- 26 Christchurch, New Zealand; and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 28 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania extend its deepest condolences to
- 29 the families and friends of the victims; and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the

- 1 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania acknowledge the efforts of the
- 2 emergency responders and law enforcement officers who risked
- 3 their lives to protect their community as well as all those who
- 4 sought to help victims during and after the shootings; and be it
- 5 further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 7 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania express its strong support for the
- 8 survivors of the terrorist attack as well as all the residents
- 9 of Christchurch, New Zealand in their recovery and healing; and
- 10 be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 12 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania commit to doing what it can to
- 13 combat the proliferation of hate, terror and violence in our
- 14 communities and in our Commonwealth; and be it further
