A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating April 26, 2019, as "Pretzel Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 2 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is the center of American pretzel
- 3 production for both the hard and crispy and the soft bread types
- 4 of pretzels; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Southeastern Pennsylvania, with its large population
- 6 of German Americans, is considered the birthplace of the
- 7 American pretzel industry and many pretzel bakers are still
- 8 located in this area today; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania produces approximately 80% of the
- 10 nation's pretzels; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Julius Sturgis Pretzel Bakery, located in
- 12 Lititz, became the first commercial hard pretzel bakery in the
- 13 United States in 1861; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The Anderson Pretzel Bakery opened in Lancaster in
- 15 1888 and calls itself the world's largest pretzel factory,

- 1 producing approximately 65 tons of hard pretzels daily; and
- WHEREAS, In 1935, the Reading Pretzel Machinery Company,
- 3 located in Reading, introduced the first automatic pretzel
- 4 twisting machine; and
- 5 WHEREAS, "National Pretzel Day" was initially declared in
- 6 1983 by United States Representative Robert S. Walker of
- 7 Lancaster County; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Former Governor Ed Rendell re-declared the holiday
- 9 in 2003 to acknowledge the importance of the pretzel to this
- 10 Commonwealth's history and economy; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate April
- 12 26, 2019, as "Pretzel Day" in Pennsylvania.
