## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Congress of the United States to ratify the United 2 States-Mexico-Canada Agreement on Trade.
- 3 WHEREAS, The United States and Canada have one of the largest
- 4 trading relationships in the world; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Canada is the United States' largest export market,
- 6 valued at \$320 billion (\$411 billion Canadian) in goods and
- 7 services in 2017, and the United States is Canada's largest
- 8 export market, valued at \$308 billion (\$396 billion Canadian) in
- 9 goods and services in 2017; and
- 10 WHEREAS, This trade supports 9 million jobs in the United
- 11 States and 2.1 million jobs in Canada; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In the more than 20 years since the United States,
- 13 Canada and Mexico entered into the North American Free Trade
- 14 Agreement (NAFTA), trade among these countries tripled from \$340
- 15 billion in 1993 to \$1.2 trillion in 2016; and
- 16 WHEREAS, North American integration of trade under NAFTA has
- 17 helped to make the region more competitive in the world economy

- 1 by providing highly integrated and valuable supply chains,
- 2 common rules and harmonized regulations that increase the speed
- 3 and global competitiveness of one another's businesses and by
- 4 driving investment and embedding value in each other's economic
- 5 success, such as creating jobs in North American communities;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, Canada and Mexico are the first-ranked and third-
- 8 ranked markets, respectively, for agriculture exports from the
- 9 United States at an estimated \$20.6 billion sent to Canada and
- 10 \$18.6 billion sent to Mexico, up from \$8.7 billion in 1992, the
- 11 year that NAFTA was signed; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement comes at a
- 13 time when the use of tariffs on steel and aluminum, announced by
- 14 the United States in March 2018, with a revocation of trade-
- 15 related waivers in June 2018, resulted in imposition of
- 16 retaliatory tariffs of \$12.8 billion from Canada and \$3 billion
- 17 in retaliatory tariffs from Mexico on products from the United
- 18 States; and
- 19 WHEREAS, In signing the United States-Mexico-Canada
- 20 Agreement, the three countries have agreed to make targeted
- 21 improvements to NAFTA and build on the successful partnership
- 22 and the shared competitiveness in the global marketplace in
- 23 which free, fair, open and mutually beneficial trade helps to
- 24 strengthen the economies of all countries; therefore be it
- 25 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 26 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge:
- 27 (1) the Congress of the United States to ratify the
- United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement on trade by all
- 29 countries as soon as possible;
- 30 (2) the Administration of the United States to renew

- 1 this country's original waiver on steel and aluminum tariffs
- 2 for Canada and Mexico; and
- 3 (3) Canada and Mexico to subsequently remove retaliatory
- 4 tariffs on all goods and services exports from the United
- 5 States;
- 6 and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Commonwealth send copies
- 8 of this resolution to the President of the United States, the
- 9 Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the
- 10 Majority Leader of the United States Senate, the Consulate of
- 11 Canada in <del>Colorado</del> PENNSYLVANIA and the Consulate of Mexico in
