A RESOLUTION

- Directing the Joint State Government Commission to study the impact of this Commonwealth's current behavioral health needs
- and behavioral health care system capacity on hospital
- 4 emergency departments and patient health.
- 5 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth is the fifth most populous state
- 6 in the United States with diverse demographics and ever-changing
- 7 health care needs; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Approximately 47.2% of adults receive behavioral
- 9 health services and 41.9% of children receive behavioral health
- 10 services; and
- 11 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth maintains a world-class health
- 12 care system dedicated to removing barriers between behavioral
- 13 health and physical health; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Patients experiencing behavioral health issues are
- 15 not well-served during long stays in hospital emergency
- 16 departments; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Hospital emergency departments are unable to find
- 18 timely and appropriate placements for individuals in need of
- 19 behavioral health services; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Prolonged and unnecessary hospital stays can have a
- 2 range of effects, including an increased dependency, a loss of a
- 3 patient's confidence in the patient's ability to cope and an
- 4 increased likelihood of long-term institutionalization;
- 5 therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint
- 7 State Government Commission to study the impact of this
- 8 Commonwealth's current behavioral health care treatment needs
- 9 and behavioral health care system capacity on this
- 10 Commonwealth's hospital emergency departments; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission study
- 12 the impact of this Commonwealth's current behavioral health care
- 13 treatment needs and behavioral health care system capacity on
- 14 patient health; and be it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission study
- 16 how current Federal and State laws and regulations impact the
- 17 ability of this Commonwealth's health care system to treat
- 18 behavioral health and physical health issues; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission study
- 20 the prevalence of psychiatric boarding, which is the holding of
- 21 patients in hospital emergency departments for more than a 24-
- 22 hour period after a patient has been admitted but not physically
- 23 transferred to an inpatient unit; and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission study
- 25 this Commonwealth's current behavioral health care treatment
- 26 needs to determine the impact of psychiatric boarding on this
- 27 Commonwealth's behavioral health care system and patients; and
- 28 be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the study include recommendations to ensure
- 30 that this Commonwealth's health care providers are able to

- 1 adequately treat patients with co-occurring behavioral health
- 2 and physical health issues; and be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission
- 4 establish an advisory committee comprised of, but not limited
- 5 to, all of the following individuals:
- 6 (1) A representative recommended by the Department of
- 7 Drug and Alcohol Programs.
- 8 (2) A representative recommended by the Department of
- 9 Human Services.
- 10 (3) A physician recommended by the Department of Health.
- 11 (4) A representative of a rural hospital recommended by
- the Hospital and Healthsystem Association of Pennsylvania.
- 13 (5) A representative of an urban hospital recommended by
- the Hospital and Healthsystem Association of Pennsylvania.
- 15 (6) A representative of a suburban hospital recommended
- by the Hospital and Healthsystem Association of Pennsylvania.
- 17 (7) A representative recommended by the Pennsylvania
- 18 College of Emergency Physicians.
- 19 (8) A representative recommended by the Pennsylvania
- 20 Medical Society.
- 21 (9) A physician who is a member of the Pennsylvania
- 22 Psychiatric Society.
- 23 (10) A representative recommended by the Drug and
- 24 Alcohol Service Providers Organization of Pennsylvania.
- 25 (11) A representative recommended by the Pennsylvania
- 26 Recovery Organizations Alliance.
- 27 (12) A representative recommended by the Pennsylvania
- organization for the National Alliance on Mental Illness.

- 30 and Community Providers Association.

- 7 (17) Any other representatives from other organizations
- 8 that are deemed appropriate by the Joint State Government
- 9 Commission;

- 11 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission issue a
- 12 report with its findings and recommendations to all of the
- 13 following:
- 14 (1) The Health and Human Services Committee of the
- 15 Senate.
- 16 (2) The Health Committee of the House of
- 17 Representatives.
- 18 (3) The Human Services Committee of the House of
- 19 Representatives;
- 20 and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission solicit
- 22 input from representatives of all aspects of the health care
- 23 sector and continuum of care to assist the Joint State
- 24 Government Commission with its findings and recommendations in
- 25 the report.
