A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of September 2019 as "Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- WHEREAS, Every woman is at risk for ovarian cancer regardless
- of age, heritage or medical history; and
- 5 WHEREAS, According to the American Cancer Society, a woman's
- 6 risk of developing ovarian cancer during her lifetime is 1 in
- 7 78; and
- 8 WHEREAS, A woman's lifetime chance of dying from ovarian
- cancer is approximately 1 in 108; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Approximately one-half of women with ovarian cancer
- 11 are 63 years of age or older; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that there
- 13 will be approximately 22,530 new cases of ovarian cancer and
- that 13,980 women will die from ovarian cancer in the United 14
- 15 States in 2019; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Approximately 20% of cases of ovarian cancer are
- 2 detected at an early stage; and
- 3 WHEREAS, When found early, about 94% of patients live longer
- 4 than five years after diagnosis; and
- 5 WHEREAS, It is important for women to have honest, open
- 6 conversations with their doctors to detect potential symptoms
- 7 early; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Ovarian cancer awareness and education are important
- 9 factors in diagnosis and treatment; therefore be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 11 month of September 2019 as "Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month" in
- 12 Pennsylvania.
