- 1 Recognizing July 17, 2019, as "Hot Dog Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 2 WHEREAS, Hot dogs are one of America's favorite and most
- 3 patriotic foods; and
- 4 WHEREAS, While its roots go back to the sausage-makers from
- 5 Vienna and Frankfurt, Americans popularized the hot dog on a bun
- 6 as we know it today; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The story of the hot dog is the story of the
- 8 industrious immigrant, the genius of marketing, the creative
- 9 cook, the child at the ballpark and the illustrious academic;

- 11 WHEREAS, Meat and poultry processors in the United States
- 12 produce more than 2 billion pounds of hot dogs each year; and
- 13 WHEREAS, More than 325,000 American workers are involved in
- 14 the production of hot dogs nationwide; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Philadelphia is the third-largest hot-dog-consuming
- 16 city in the United States; therefore be it

- 2 17, 2019, as "Hot Dog Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the
- 4 cultural significance of this staple of American life found in
- 5 many variations across this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage all
- 7 citizens to celebrate the iconic status of the hot dog in
- 8 American and Pennsylvanian culture.
