A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the National Days of Prayer and Remembrance for the victims and heroes of the terror attacks on September 11,
- 3 2001.
- WHEREAS, Approximately 3,000 people from 93 nations died as a
- 5 result of the attacks on September 11, 2001; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Among the 414 emergency workers and first responders
- 7 in New York City who lost their lives, 343 were firefighters of
- 8 the New York City Fire Department, 37 were police officers of
- 9 the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey Police Department,
- 10 23 were police officers of the New York City Police Department,
- 11 10 were emergency medical technicians and paramedics and one was
- 12 a patrolman from the New York Fire Patrol; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Survivors have suffered from chronic respiratory
- 14 complications and post-traumatic stress disorder following the
- 15 aftermath of the September 11 attacks; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The heroic actions of emergency workers and first

- 1 responders on the day of the attacks saved countless lives; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Their memory should always be remembered and
- 3 honored; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Every year, the days leading up to and including the
- 5 anniversary of September 11, 2001, are designated as National
- 6 Days of Prayer and Remembrance; therefore be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 8 National Days of Prayer and Remembrance for the victims and
- 9 heroes of the terror attacks on September 11, 2001; and be it
- 10 further

- 12 and heroes of the terror attacks on September 11, 2001.
