- Recognizing the month of October 2019 as "Blindness Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, More than 25 million Americans report experiencing
- 4 significant vision loss, including approximately 6.5 million
- 5 seniors 65 years of age or older; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The leading cause of vision impairment for
- 7 individuals over 50 years of age is age-related macular
- 8 degeneration, with approximately 15 million Americans affected
- 9 and 200,000 new cases reported annually; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Since its founding in 1910, the Pennsylvania
- 11 Association for the Blind and its member agencies have
- 12 tirelessly supported and promoted the interests of individuals
- 13 who are blind or visually impaired and provided essential
- 14 services to assist blind Pennsylvanians in achieving self-
- 15 reliance and autonomy; and

- 2 of the Pennsylvania Association for the Blind as they enhance
- 3 public awareness on the prevention and treatment of blindness
- 4 and other serious vision impairments which are highlighted
