## A RESOLUTION

Recognizing October 24, 2019, as "Lights On Afterschool Day" in 2 Pennsylvania. 3 WHEREAS, The residents of this Commonwealth stand firmly 4 committed to quality afterschool programs and opportunities 5 because they: 6 provide safe, challenging and engaging learning experiences that help children develop social, emotional, physical and academic skills; 8 9 support working families by ensuring that their 10 children are safe and productive after the regular school day ends: 11 12 build stronger communities by involving students, 13 parents, business leaders and adult volunteers in the lives 14 of young people, thereby promoting positive relationships 15 among youths, families and adults; and

engage families, schools and community partners in

- 1 advancing the welfare of our children;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth has provided significant
- 4 leadership in the area of community involvement in the education
- 5 and well-being of our youths, grounded in the principle that
- 6 quality afterschool programs are key to helping our children
- 7 become successful adults; and
- 8 WHEREAS, It is estimated that every \$1 invested in
- 9 afterschool programs saves \$3 by increasing students' earning
- 10 potential, improving students' performance at school and
- 11 reducing crime and welfare costs; and
- 12 WHEREAS, For students in kindergarten through twelfth grade,
- 13 more than 89% of their time is spent learning outside school
- 14 during afterschool and summer programs, in libraries, museums
- 15 and science centers or at home or in the community; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Afterschool programs engage students in hands-on,
- 17 real world science, technology, engineering and mathematics
- 18 (STEM) projects to help build vital 21st-century skills,
- 19 cultivate an interest in STEM and offer innovative ways for
- 20 students to connect STEM to their lives and community; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Approximately 19.4 million families report that they
- 22 would enroll their child in an afterschool program if one were
- 23 available; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Afterschool programs can provide holistic support
- 25 for children and improve the development of social and emotional
- 26 competencies such as problem solving, critical thinking and
- 27 interpersonal skills; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Many afterschool programs across the country are
- 29 facing funding shortfalls so severe that they are being forced
- 30 to close their doors and turn off their lights; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth is committed to investing in the
- 2 health and safety of all young people by providing expanded
- 3 learning opportunities that help to close the achievement gap
- 4 and prepare young people to compete in the global economy; and
- 5 WHEREAS, "Lights On Afterschool," the national celebration of
- 6 afterschool programs held this year on October 24, 2019,
- 7 promotes the importance of quality afterschool programs in the
- 8 lives of children, families and communities; therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize October
- 10 24, 2019, as "Lights On Afterschool Day" in Pennsylvania; and be
- 11 it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives enthusiastically
- 13 endorse "Lights On Afterschool" and commit this Commonwealth to
- 14 engage in innovative afterschool programs and activities which
- 15 ensure that the lights stay on and the doors stay open for all
- 16 children after school.
