A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life of Barbara Elaine Smith and expressing 2 condolences upon her passing.
- 3 WHEREAS, Barbara Elaine Smith, known professionally as B.
- 4 Smith, was born August 24, 1949, in Everson, Pennsylvania, to a
- 5 father who was a steelworker and a mother who was a part-time
- 6 housekeeper; and
- 7 WHEREAS, B. Smith graduated from Southmoreland High School
- 8 and attended modeling school in Pittsburgh, starting her
- 9 illustrious career as a model; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In July 1976, at 26 years of age, B. Smith became
- 11 one of the first African-American women on the cover of
- 12 Mademoiselle magazine; and
- 13 WHEREAS, B. Smith's modeling career included gracing the
- 14 cover of 15 magazines and starring in multiple television and
- 15 radio advertisements; and
- 16 WHEREAS, B. Smith also served as a spokeswoman for well-known
- 17 companies and products, including Verizon, Colgate, Palmolive

- 1 Oxy and McCormick's Lawry's seasonings products; and
- 2 WHEREAS, In addition to a successful modeling career, B.
- 3 Smith hosted the nationally syndicated cable television show, B.
- 4 Smith with Style, which debuted in 1997 and aired for nearly a
- 5 decade in more than 90% of American households and in 40
- 6 countries; and
- 7 WHEREAS, B. Smith was an accomplished restaurateur who opened
- 8 restaurants in Washington, DC, and Manhattan and Sag Harbor, New
- 9 York; and
- 10 WHEREAS, B. Smith was also a distinguished author who wrote
- 11 three home entertaining books, including "B. Smith's
- 12 Entertaining and Cooking for Friends," which was the first
- 13 tabletop entertainment and lifestyle book written by an African
- 14 American; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The "B. Smith with Style Home Collection," which
- 16 included bedding, tabletop and bath products, was the first line
- 17 from an African-American woman to be sold at a nationwide
- 18 retailer; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The National Museum of African American History and
- 20 Culture has displayed B. Smith's signature tagline of "Whatever
- 21 you do, do it with style!"; and
- 22 WHEREAS, B. Smith was a renowned nonprofessional chef and was
- 23 inducted into the American Chef Corps in 2012; and
- 24 WHEREAS, In 2013, at 64 years of age, B. Smith was diagnosed
- 25 with early-onset Alzheimer's disease; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Older African Americans are almost twice as likely
- 27 as older Caucasians to have Alzheimer's disease or another form
- 28 of dementia; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is the sixth leading cause of
- 30 death in the United States and approximately 280,000

- 1 Pennsylvanians are living with Alzheimer's disease; and
- 2 WHEREAS, B. Smith soon went public with her diagnosis and
- 3 worked tirelessly to destigmatize and raise awareness of
- 4 Alzheimer's disease and its impact on the African-American
- 5 community; and
- 6 WHEREAS, That work included public appearances and writing
- 7 the book "Before I Forget," which is the story of B. Smith's
- 8 battle with Alzheimer's disease; and
- 9 WHEREAS, B. Smith lost her battle with Alzheimer's disease
- 10 and passed away on February 22, 2020, at 70 years of age; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The life and accomplishments of B. Smith are an
- 12 inspiration to many; therefore be it
- 13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the life,
- 14 accomplishments and memory of Barbara Elaine Smith.
