A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in taxation and finance, further providing for exemptions and special provisions.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby resolves as follows:
6	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
7	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
8	That section 2(c) of Article VIII be amended to read:
9	§ 2. Exemptions and special provisions.

11	(c) Citizens and residents of this Commonwealth, who served
12	in any war or armed conflict in which the United States was
13	engaged and were honorably discharged or released under
14	honorable circumstances from active service, shall be exempt
15	from the payment of [all] <u>a portion of</u> real property taxes upon
16	the residence occupied by the said citizens and residents of

this Commonwealth imposed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or 1 2 any of its political subdivisions if, as a result of military 3 service, they are blind, paraplegic or double or quadruple amputees or have a service-connected disability declared by the 4 United States [Veterans Administration] Department of Veterans 5 Affairs or its successor to be a [total or 100%] permanent 6 7 disability of 50% or greater, and if the State Veterans' 8 Commission determines that such persons are in need of the tax 9 exemptions granted herein. The percentage of exemption from real 10 property taxes shall be in direct proportion to the percentage 11 of disability. This exemption shall be extended to the unmarried 12 surviving spouse upon the death of an eligible veteran provided that the State Veterans' Commission determines that such person 13 14 is in need of the exemption.

15 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General 16 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the 17 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to 18 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article 19 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in 20 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after 21 22 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.

23 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this 24 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the 25 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the 26 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the 27 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required 28 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such 29 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the 30

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Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first primary, general or municipal election which meets the requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is passed by the General Assembly.
