17	(1) Within 180 days of the effective date of this
18	subsection, the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
19	shall prepare a financial analysis of fees, fines, penalties,
20	royalties, Federal and State appropriations and other sources

1	of revenue received by the commission and of expenditures,
2	including annual operating costs, investments, land purchases
3	and capital projects to carry out the financial analysis
4	under this subsection:
5	(i) The commission shall provide records, financial
6	statements and other documents reflecting the revenue and
7	expenditures subject to the financial analysis under this
8	subsection.
9	(ii) The commission shall respond to inquiries and
10	requests for information from the Legislative Budget and
11	Finance Committee in a timely manner.

- 27 shall be in violation of this section.

2	within a seven-year period is a summary offense of the fifth
3	degree and may result in forfeiture of the privilege to hunt
4	or take game or wildlife anywhere within this Commonwealth

6	(a) General rule A person, while engaged in hunting or
7	furtaking, commits an offense if, knowing that the person is not
8	licensed or privileged to do so, the person:
9	(1) enters or remains on any land of another without
10	authorization to do so, when the land is posted in a manner
11	prescribed by law or reasonably likely to come to the
12	person's attention or is fenced or enclosed in a manner
13	manifestly designed to exclude trespassers; or
14	(2) enters or remains on any land of another without
15	authorization and defies an order not to enter or to leave
16	that has been personally communicated to the person by the
17	owner of the land or other authorized person.
18	(b) PenaltyAn offense under this section shall be graded
19	as follows:
20	(1) A person who violates subsection (a)(1) commits a
21	summary offense of the third degree.
22	(2) A person who violates subsection (a)(2) commits a
23	misdemeanor.
24	(3) A person who commits a second or subsequent
25	violation of this section within a seven-year period commits
26	a misdemeanor, and the second or subsequent violation shall
