AN ACT

Amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), entitled "An act establishing a uniform construction code; imposing 2 powers and duties on municipalities and the Department of 3 Labor and Industry; providing for enforcement; imposing 4 penalties; and making repeals," in preliminary provisions, 5 further providing for definitions and for application. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 103 of the act of November 10, 1999 10 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, is amended by adding a definition to read: 11 12 Section 103. Definitions. 13 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 14 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 15 context clearly indicates otherwise: 16 17 "Historical agricultural building." A building initially constructed before January 1, 1999, as an agricultural building 18

and that is used for occupancy by the general public for

weddings, receptions and similar social events throughout the

3	Section 2. Section 104(b) of the act is amended by adding a
4	paragraph to read:

7	(b) Exclusions This act shall not apply to any of the
8	following:

10	(4.1) An historical agricultural building, provided that
11	the owner of the building annually files an affidavit with
12	the municipality stating that the following conditions are
13	satisfied or, if the owner fails to do so, the municipality
14	inspects the building AT THE OWNER'S EXPENSE and determines <
15	that the following conditions are satisfied:
16	(i) An inspection report by a construction code <
17	official CODE ADMINISTRATOR states that the building <
18	complies with the fire safety provisions for historic
19	buildings of the International Code Council's
20	International Existing Building Code that was part of the
21	Uniform Construction Code at the time of inspection,
22	provided that the building is not required to install an
23	automatic fire sprinkler system.
24	(ii) The building has functioning smoke detectors. <-
25	(II) THE BUILDING HAS FUNCTIONING:
26	(A) HARD-WIRED SMOKE DETECTORS IF ELECTRICAL
27	WIRING HAS BEEN INSTALLED IN THE INTERIOR OF THE
28	BUILDING; OR
29	(B) BATTERY-POWERED DETECTORS IF ELECTRICAL
30	WIRING HAS NOT BEEN INSTALLED IN THE INTERIOR OF THE

1	BUILDING.
2	(iii) Portable fire extinguishers are placed in the
3	building consistent with the Uniform Construction Code.
4	(iv) If electrical wiring has been installed in the
5	interior of the building, an inspection report by a
6	construction code official CODE ADMINISTRATOR states that <
7	the wiring complies with the electrical provisions of the
8	Uniform Construction Code that existed at the time of
9	inspection.
10	(v) Smoking is prohibited in the building.
11	(vi) All open flames are prohibited in the building,
12	except for flames used for the purposes of reheating or
13	maintaining food temperatures and for which the heating
14	source requires no installation as part of the building
15	construction.
16	(vii) The owner maintains for the building liability
17	insurance that is written and issued by an insurer
18	authorized to do business in this Commonwealth.
19	(viii) Signs are posted at the external entrances to
20	all areas of the building used for weddings, receptions
21	and similar social events that state: "This facility is <
22	AND SIMILAR SOCIAL EVENTS THAT STATE:
23	(A) THE MAXIMUM OCCUPANCY OF THE BUILDING PER
24	THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE
25	THAT WAS PART OF THE UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE AT THE
26	TIME OF THE INSPECTION.
27	(B) "THIS FACILITY IS subject to alternative
28	commercial building and public safety requirements as
29	provided under the Pennsylvania Construction Code
30	Act."

1	(IX) UNLESS PERMITTED TOILET FACILITIES ARE PROVIDED <
2	ON THE GROUNDS OF THE BUILDING, PORTABLE TOILET
3	FACILITIES ARE PROVIDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MINIMUM
4	NUMBER OF REQUIRED TOILETS FOR A RESTAURANT OR BANQUET
5	HALL IN THE INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE THAT WAS PART OF
6	THE UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE AT THE TIME OF INSPECTION.
7	(X) AN INSPECTION REPORT BY A CODE ADMINISTRATOR
8	STATES THAT THE BUILDING COMPLIES WITH THE ACCESSIBILITY
9	PROVISIONS FOR HISTORIC BUILDINGS IN THE INTERNATIONAL
10	CODE COUNCIL'S INTERNATIONAL EXISTING BUILDING CODE
11	DETERMINED BY THE ACCESSIBILITY ADVISORY BOARD.
12	(XI) AN INSPECTION REPORT BY A CODE ADMINISTRATOR
13	STATES THAT THE BUILDING COMPLIES WITH THE CHANGE OF USE
14	PROVISIONS FOR HISTORIC BUILDINGS IN THE INTERNATIONAL
15	CODE COUNCIL'S INTERNATIONAL EXISTING BUILDING CODE THAT
16	WAS PART OF THE UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE AT THE TIME OF
17	INSPECTION.
18	(XII) THE PRIMARY FUNCTION REMAINS ON THE LEVEL OF
19	EXIT DISCHARGE. THE OCCUPANCY LEVEL OF THE STORIES IN A
20	MULTILEVEL BUILDING MUST BE DETERMINED BY THE CODE
21	ADMINISTRATOR AND MAY NOT TO EXCEED LEVELS AS DETERMINED
22	BY THE INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE THAT WAS PART OF THE
23	UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE AT THE TIME OF INSPECTION.

25	Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
