AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," establishing the Public Higher Education Funding Commission.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an
11	article to read:
12	ARTICLE XX-I
13	MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS RELATING TO
14	INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION
15	Section 2001-I. Public Higher Education Funding Commission.
16	(a) EstablishmentThe Public Higher Education Funding
17	Commission is established.
18	(b) DutiesThe commission shall review and make
19	recommendations related to higher education funding,

1	affordability and effectiveness and administration and
2	operations as provided in this section.
3	<u>(c) Membership</u>
4	(1) The commission shall consist of the following
5	members:
6	(i) The chair and minority chair of the
7	Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chair and
8	minority chair of the Appropriations Committee of the
9	House of Representatives.
10	(ii) The chair and minority chair of the Education
11	Committee of the Senate and the chair and minority chair
12	of the Education Committee of the House of
13	Representatives.
14	(iii) Two legislators appointed by the President pro
15	tempore of the Senate.
16	(iv) Two legislators to be appointed by the Speaker
17	of the House of Representatives.
18	(v) One legislator to be appointed by the Minority
19	Leader of the Senate.
20	(vi) One legislator to be appointed by the Minority
21	Leader of the House of Representatives.
22	(vii) The Secretary of Education.
23	(2) The commission shall appoint a member to serve as
24	chair of the commission.
25	<u>(d) Meetings</u>
26	(1) The commission shall hold its first meeting within
27	45 days of the effective date of this section, regardless of
28	whether all legislative caucuses have approved members to the
29	commission.
30	(2) The commission shall hold meetings at the call of

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1 <u>the chair.</u>

2	(e) Payments to membersThe members may not receive
3	compensation for their services, but shall be reimbursed for all
4	necessary travel and other reasonable expenses incurred in
5	connection with the performance of their duties as members of
6	the commission.
7	(f) Administrative supportThe General Assembly shall
8	provide administrative support, meeting space and any other
9	assistance required by the commission to carry out its duties
10	under this section in cooperation with the department. The
11	department shall provide the commission with data, research and
12	other information upon request by the commission.
13	(g) Cooperation from public institutions of higher
14	educationThe public institutions of higher education shall
15	provide meeting space and any other assistance required by the
16	commission to carry out its duties under this section. The
17	public institutions of higher education shall provide the
18	commission with data, research and other information upon
19	request of the chairman.
20	(h) Higher education funding formulaThe commission shall
21	develop a higher education funding formula and identify factors
22	that may be used to determine the distribution of funding among
23	the public institutions of higher education. The factors
24	identified under this subsection may include all of the
25	following:
26	(1) Goals for higher education.
27	(2) Goals for higher education completion and
28	<u>attainment.</u>
29	(3) This Commonwealth's higher education needs.
30	(4) The affordability of higher education for residents

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1	<u>of this Commonwealth.</u>
2	(5) Resident and nonresident undergraduate and graduate
3	enrollments.
4	(6) Graduation rates.
5	(7) Retention rates.
6	(8) Time to degree, including associate's degrees and
7	bachelor's degrees.
8	(9) Cost per degree, including tuition and fees.
9	(10) Operational cost per full-time student.
10	(11) Student debt, including debt of graduates and
11	noncompleters.
12	(12) Student financial aid, including programs operated
13	by the agency.
14	(13) Job placement after graduation.
15	(14) Entry level wages.
16	(15) Degrees granted in occupations that will align with
17	the Commonwealth's long-term economic needs.
18	(16) Utilization of existing educational programs and
19	facilities.
20	(17) Transfer and articulation of credits between public
21	institutions of higher education.
22	(18) Institutional mission, including metrics that
23	reflect differences in the missions between the institutions.
24	(19) The appropriate level of recurring State support to
25	maintain operations.
26	(20) The appropriate level of formula driven funding to
27	<u>incentivize success.</u>
28	(21) The access and success of underrepresented
29	populations.
30	(22) Comparisons of the factors contained in this
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1	section with those factors for private institutions of higher
2	education that are located inside and outside this
3	Commonwealth, when available.
4	(23) Other factors related to higher education and the
5	distribution of higher education funding that the commission
6	deems appropriate.
7	(i) Additional powers and dutiesThe commission shall have
8	all of the following powers and duties:
9	(1) Review and make findings and recommendations related
10	to higher education funding in this Commonwealth.
11	(2) Consult with and utilize experts to assist the
12	commission in carrying out the duties under this subsection.
13	(3) Receive input from interested parties, including,
14	but not limited to, public institutions of higher education.
15	(4) Hold public hearings in different regions of this
16	Commonwealth.
17	(5) Review and consider higher education funding
18	formulas and factors utilized throughout the United States.
19	(6) In identifying the higher education funding factors
20	under subsection (h) and in completing the report required
21	under this subsection, consider the impact these factors may
22	have on the distribution of higher education funding among
23	the public institutions of higher education.
24	(7) Review the administration and operation of State and
25	regional higher education programs and services, including
26	the public institutions of higher education and the agency to
27	determine if cost savings for the Commonwealth and its
28	students may be achieved and make recommendations to
29	implement savings and efficiencies.
30	(8) Review the administration and operations of State

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1	and regional higher education programs and services,
2	including the public institutions of higher education and the
3	agency, and make recommendations regarding administration and
4	operations.
5	(9) Prior to recommending a higher education funding
6	formula under this section, consider the potential
7	consequences of a higher education funding formula that does
8	not allocate to each public institution of higher education
9	at least the same level or proportion of State funding as the
10	institution received in the prior fiscal year.
11	(10) Prior to recommending a higher education funding
12	formula under this section, consider nationally accepted
13	accounting and budgeting standards.
14	(11) Develop a proposed higher education funding formula
15	and factors pursuant to subsection (h).
16	(12) Draft proposed legislation based on the
17	commission's findings.
18	(13) Issue a report of the commission's findings and
19	recommendations to the Governor, the President pro tempore of
20	the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the
21	Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the Senate, the
22	Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the House of
23	Representatives, the Secretary of Education and the State
24	Board of Education, the Appropriations Committee of the
25	Senate, the Appropriations Committee of the House of
26	Representatives, the Education Committee of the Senate and
27	the Education Committee of the House of Representatives not
28	later than one year after the effective date of this section.
29	(j) Effective date of higher education funding formulaThe
30	higher education funding formula developed by the commission

1	shall not go into effect unless the formula is approved by an
2	act of the General Assembly enacted after the effective date of
3	this section.
4	(k) Continuation of commissionEvery five years the
5	commission shall be reconstituted in accordance with subsection
6	(c) and shall meet and hold public hearings to review the
7	operation of the higher education funding provisions of this
8	section and shall make a further report and issue the report to
9	the recipients listed in subsection (i)(13).
10	(1) Level of state funding through appropriationsThe
11	General Assembly shall, through the annual appropriations
12	process, determine the level of State funding for public
13	institutions of higher education.
14	(m) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
15	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
16	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
17	"Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
18	Agency.
19	"Commission." The Public Higher Education Funding Commission
20	established under this section.
21	"Department." The Department of Education of the
22	Commonwealth.
23	"Public institution of higher education." A State-owned
24	university, a State-related university, a community college, the
25	Pennsylvania College of Technology and the Thaddeus Stevens
26	<u>College of Technology.</u>
27	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
