AN ACT

1 2 3	Requiring health insurance policies to provide coverage for preexposure prophylaxis HIV medication and providing for enforcement by the Insurance Commissioner.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Preexposure
8	Prophylaxis HIV Medication Coverage Act.
9	Section 2. Definitions.
10	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
11	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
12	context clearly indicates otherwise:
13	"Health insurance policy." An individual or group health
14	insurance policy, contract or plan that provides medical or
15	health care coverage by a health care facility or licensed
16	health care provider on an expense-incurred service or prepaid
17	basis that is offered by or is governed under any of the
18	following:

(1) The act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as
 The Insurance Company Law of 1921.

3 (2) The act of December 29, 1972 (P.L.1701, No.364),
4 known as the Health Maintenance Organization Act.

5 (3) The act of May 18, 1976 (P.L.123, No.54), known as
6 the Individual Accident and Sickness Insurance Minimum
7 Standards Act.

8 (4) A nonprofit corporation subject to 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61 (relating to hospital plan corporations) or 63 (relating to 9 10 professional health services plan corporations). The term does not include accident only, fixed indemnity, 11 limited benefit, credit, dental, vision, specified disease, 12 13 Medicare supplement, Civilian Health and Medical Program of the 14 Uniformed Services (CHAMPUS) supplement, long-term care or 15 disability income, workers' compensation or automobile medical 16 payment insurance.

17 "Preexposure prophylaxis HIV medication." A medication that 18 is approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration 19 that can be taken as a prophylaxis to prevent the transmission 20 of the human immunodeficiency virus.

21 Section 3. Mandated coverage.

(a) General rule.--A health insurance policy that is
delivered, issued for delivery, renewed, extended or modified in
this Commonwealth on or after the effective date of this section
shall provide coverage for the expenses of a preexposure
prophylaxis HIV medication.

(b) Specialty tier.--Insurance providers may not move any
preexposure prophylaxis HIV medication into a specialty tier
solely for monetary gains.

30 (c) Counseling.--No health care plan may impose counseling 20190SB0667PN0811 - 2 - from an infectious disease specialist or immunologist in order
 to receive preexposure prophylaxis HIV medication unless
 medically necessary.

4 Section 4. Violations and enforcement.

5 A violation of this act shall constitute a violation of 6 subdivision (b) of Article VI of the act of May 17, 1921 7 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, 8 and shall be enforced by the Insurance Commissioner as provided 9 under section 628 of that act.

10 Section 5. Effective date.

11 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
