AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in inspection of vehicles, further providing for requirement for periodic inspection of vehicles. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 4702(q) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a paragraph and the 7 section is amended by adding subsections to read: 8 9 § 4702. Requirement for periodic inspection of vehicles. 10 11 Exceptions. -- The following are exceptions to subsection 12 (f): * * * 13 (5) Emission inspection criteria for newest model year 14 15 vehicles. -- A subject vehicle shall be exempt from the 16 requirements for emission inspection for eight years after 17 the vehicle is manufactured. A one-time certificate of 18 exemption shall be affixed to the subject vehicle for the

- 1 <u>entire duration of the exemption and in a manner prescribed</u>
- 2 <u>by department regulation. After the eighth year, the subject</u>
- 3 vehicle shall receive an emission inspection in accordance
- 4 with this section. The department shall notify the official
- 5 inspection stations on a periodic basis of vehicles exempt
- from the requirements for emission inspection.
- 7 (h) Notification to Environmental Protection Agency. -- The
- 8 <u>Department of Environmental Protection shall immediately notify</u>
- 9 the Environmental Protection Agency of the modifications to the
- 10 vehicle emission program in subsections (g) (5) and (j) and of
- 11 the intent to seek its approval of the plan in accordance with
- 12 the requirements of Federal law. The department shall notify the
- 13 chair and minority chair of the Transportation Committee of the
- 14 Senate, the chair and minority chair of the Transportation
- 15 Committee of the House of Representatives, the chair and
- 16 minority chair of the Environmental Resources and Energy
- 17 Committee of the Senate and the chair and minority chair of the
- 18 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the House of
- 19 Representatives of the department's notification to the
- 20 Environmental Protection Agency.
- 21 (i) Notice of approval. -- Upon approval by the Environmental
- 22 Protection Agency under subsection (h), the secretary shall
- 23 transmit notice of the approval to the Legislative Reference
- 24 Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. The
- 25 <u>emission inspection criteria under subsection (g)(5) shall apply</u>
- 26 120 days following publication of the notice.
- 27 (j) Antitampering inspections. -- Notwithstanding the
- 28 provisions of subsection (q) (5), the eight most recent model
- 29 year vehicles shall be subject to visual antitampering
- 30 inspections for the presence of emissions control components

- 1 <u>installed on the vehicle by manufacturers, which may occur</u>
- 2 <u>during the annual safety inspection.</u>
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 120 days.
