To provide appropriations from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 2 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 3 fiscal year July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, and for the 4 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close 5 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020; to provide 6 7 appropriations from special funds and accounts to the Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, and for the payment of bills 8 9 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 10 11 30, 2020; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year 12 July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, and for the payment of bills 13 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 14 30, 2020; and to provide for the additional appropriation of 15 Federal and State funds to the Executive and Judicial 16 Departments for the fiscal year July 1, 2019, to June 30, 17 2020, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining 18 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019. 19 20 TABLE OF CONTENTS 21 PART I. - 2 the current fiscal year are appropriated.
- 3 (b) Department of Human Services. -- The Federal
- 4 appropriations to the Department of Human Services include any
- 5 prior earnings that may be received during the current fiscal
- 6 year. In addition to the amounts specifically appropriated in
- 7 this act to the Department of Human Services, all moneys
- 8 appropriated from the Federal Government during a previous
- 9 fiscal year which are expected to be received as reimbursements
- 10 may be carried forward until the close of the current fiscal
- 11 year to the extent that obligations are carried forward. In
- 12 addition, reimbursements actually received to support the
- 13 obligations may also be carried forward.
- 14 Section 6104. Subgrants between Federal appropriations.
- 15 Subgrants may be made between Federal appropriations without
- 16 further approval of the General Assembly. The Secretary of the
- 17 Budget shall submit a list of subgrants to the chair and
- 18 minority chair of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and
- 19 the chair and minority chair of the Appropriations Committee of
- 20 the House of Representatives quarterly. No subgrant to a State
- 21 agency, however, may be made from a restricted receipt account
- 22 without a specific appropriation by the General Assembly.
- 23 Section 6105. Utilization of emergency Federal funds.
- 24 (a) Natural disasters and civil disobedience. -- Federal funds
- 25 available for costs and damages resulting from natural disasters
- 26 or civil disobedience may be added to an appropriation contained
- 27 in this act or to funds otherwise appropriated or may be used
- 28 for the purposes prescribed by the Federal Government.
- 29 (b) Other emergencies. -- In addition to the moneys
- 30 appropriated by this act, moneys received from the Federal

- 1 Government for the purpose of disaster assistance or relief, or
- 2 other moneys received as a direct result of terrorist acts,
- 3 moneys for homeland security and defense and moneys for avian
- 4 flu/pandemic preparedness shall be paid into the General Fund
- 5 and are appropriated out of the General Fund to the departments,
- 6 boards, commissions or agencies designated by the Governor.
- 7 (c) Executive authorization. -- In the event of an emergency
- 8 situation in which the General Assembly cannot act in sufficient
- 9 time, the Governor is authorized through executive authorization
- 10 to provide up to \$10,000,000 in Federal funds to alleviate the
- 11 emergency situation.
- 12 (d) Definition. -- For the purposes of this section,
- 13 "emergency" is defined as a situation in which there is a chance
- 14 of or which may result in substantial human suffering.
- 15 Section 6106. Transfer of funds from TANFBG to CCDFBG and SSBG.
- 16 In accordance with Federal law which permits the transfer of
- 17 funds from the TANFBG to the CCDFBG and SSBG, the Department of
- 18 Human Services, upon approval of the Secretary of the Budget,
- 19 may transfer funds, provided that the transfer will not result
- 20 in a deficit in an appropriation from which funds are
- 21 transferred. The Secretary of the Budget shall provide 10 days'
- 22 prior notification of the transfer to the chair and the minority
- 23 chair of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the
- 24 chair and minority chair of the Appropriations Committee of the
- 25 House of Representatives.
- 26 Section 6107. Nonemergency Federal appropriation.
- 27 The appropriation in section 202 to the Executive Offices,
- 28 Office of the Budget as a Federal grant award reserve account is
- 29 established to ensure the Commonwealth can accept additional
- 30 nonemergency, nonmandatory Federal funds that become available

- 1 during the fiscal year of the Commonwealth. The Secretary of the
- 2 Budget shall transfer the Federal authority required, limited to
- 3 the appropriation amount enacted, to other Federal accounts of
- 4 the Commonwealth to avoid the loss of Federal funds. The State
- 5 Treasurer shall make appropriate adjustments to the accounts of
- 6 the Commonwealth upon receipt of expenditure symbol
- 7 notifications.
- 8 PART LXXI
- 9 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS
- 10 FOR CURRENT FISCAL YEAR
- 11 Section 7101. Prior laws unaffected.
- 12 This act is not intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal
- 13 any provision of any act enacted at this or any prior session of
- 14 the General Assembly regulating the purchase of supplies, the
- 15 ordering of printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and
- 16 use of motor vehicles, the method of making payments from the
- 17 State Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any
- 18 administrative department, board or commission.
- 19 Section 7102. Compliance with other law before funds available.
- No appropriation made by this act to any department, board,
- 21 commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be
- 22 available unless and until the department, board, commission or
- 23 agency has complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of
- 24 April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative
- 25 Code of 1929.
- 26 Section 7103. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or
- committing funds.
- Funds available to agencies, boards, departments, commissions
- 29 or other governmental entities under this act for the
- 30 procurement of supplies, services or construction shall not be

- 1 available for payment of or to be committed to or encumbered for
- 2 payment of the procurement unless and until the agency, board,
- 3 department or other governmental entity has complied with all of
- 4 the requirements applicable to the procurement that are
- 5 specified in 62 Pa.C.S. (relating to procurement) and in the
- 6 policies, procedures and regulations instituted in accordance
- 7 with 62 Pa.C.S.
- 8 Section 7104. Minority business set-asides.
- 9 (a) Duty to report.--Each department or other
- 10 instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed in Subpart A of Part
- 11 II authorized to contract for buildings, highways, commodities,
- 12 equipment, supplies or services shall report to the General
- 13 Assembly all information pertinent to anticipated procurement
- 14 needs at the beginning of each quarter during a fiscal year.
- 15 (b) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "minority
- 16 business" means a minority business enterprise as defined in the
- 17 act of July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the
- 18 Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act.
- 19 Section 7105. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous
- sources.
- 21 In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act:
- 22 (1) Moneys received in payment for food and household
- supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except
- 24 inmates, by an institution and moneys received from the
- 25 proceeds from the sale of products of the soil, meats,
- livestock, timber or other materials sold by a department or
- agency of the Commonwealth shall be paid into the General
- Fund and are appropriated out of the General Fund to the
- 29 several respective institutions for the operation and
- 30 maintenance of the institutions.

- 1 (2) Moneys received from any other source, except the
- 2 Federal Government, as contributions for the purposes
- 3 specified in the respective appropriations or as payment for
- 4 services or materials furnished by one institution to
- 5 another, except those collections designated as revenues,
- 6 shall be paid into the General Fund and are appropriated out
- of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective
- 8 appropriations.
- 9 (3) Moneys received by a department or agency of the
- 10 Commonwealth from other sources, except the Federal
- 11 Government, as contributions or supplements to the department
- 12 or agency for a program or administration of an act included
- in this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited
- 14 to the appropriation for that program or administration of
- 15 the act.
- 16 Section 7106. Lapsing of unused funds.
- 17 (a) General rule.--Except as otherwise provided by law or by
- 18 this section, that part of all appropriations in this act
- 19 unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of the close of the
- 20 current fiscal year shall automatically lapse as of that day.
- 21 (b) Exceptions. -- The following shall be continuing
- 22 appropriations:
- 23 (1) The appropriation in section 236 to the Health Care
- 24 Cost Containment Council.
- 25 (2) The appropriation in section 241 to the Supreme
- 26 Court for the unified judicial system security program.

- 1 (c) Nonapplicability. -- This section does not apply to Part

- 3 Section 7107. Appellate courts appropriation contingency.
- 4 The appropriations in sections 241, 242 and 243 to the
- 5 Supreme, Superior and Commonwealth Courts, respectively, for
- 6 justice and judge expenses are contingent upon a vouchered
- 7 expense account plan being continued by the Supreme Court.
- 8 Section 7108. Transfer of excess funds.
- 9 The Governor may transfer moneys in funds receiving proceeds
- 10 of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania general obligation bonds in
- 11 excess of the amount necessary for the purposes for which the
- 12 bonds were issued to the appropriate sinking fund for payment of
- 13 debt service due on outstanding bonds. If the excess money,
- 14 together with any available balance, exceeds the amount of debt
- 15 service remaining to be paid, the money shall be transferred to
- 16 the General Fund or to the appropriate special fund responsible
- 17 for the debt service.
- 18 Section 7109. Transfers for government support agencies.
- During the current fiscal year, any prior year amount
- 20 unexpended on the effective date of this section may, upon the

- 23 Representatives and the Majority Leader of the House of
- 24 Representatives, be transferred between any of the following

- 7 (11) Independent Regulatory Review Commission.
- 8 (12) Capitol Preservation Committee.
- 9 (13) Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing.
- 10 (14) Host State Committee expenses CSG.
- 11 (15) Restricted Account for Leave Payout Expenses.
- 12 Section 7110. Transfers for Legislative Reapportionment
- 13 Commission.
- 14 The appropriation in this act or in any other fiscal year to
- 15 the Legislative Reapportionment Commission remaining unexpended
- 16 and unencumbered on the effective date of this section may, upon
- 17 the written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the
- 18 Senate, the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the
- 19 House of Representatives and the Majority Leader of the House of
- 20 Representatives, be transferred to any other account of the
- 21 Senate and the House of Representatives, as they deem necessary.
- 22 Section 7111. Administration of Human Services Block Grant.
- 23 The Department of Human Services shall allocate and disburse
- 24 appropriations in this act for the Human Services Block Grant
- 25 Program established under Article XIV-B of the act of June 13,
- 26 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, to
- 27 counties participating in that program. Each participating
- 28 county may adjust the expenditure of the county's Human Services
- 29 Block Grant Program allocation between those appropriations in
- 30 accordance with, and as authorized by, the applicable provision

- 1 of Article XIV-B of the Human Services Code.

- 4 Section 8101. Effective date.
- 5 This act shall take effect as follows:
- 6 (1) This section shall take effect immediately.
- 7 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect July 1,
