## AN ACT

- Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for countywide reopening plan for businesses.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 13 § 5901. Definitions.
- 14 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 15 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 16 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 17 "Business." A corporation, partnership, limited liability
- 18 company, limited liability partnership, business trust, sole

- 1 proprietor, or other individual or entity doing business and
- 2 operating within a physical location in this Commonwealth,
- 3 regardless of whether the physical location is open to the
- 4 <u>public</u>.
- 5 "Communicable disease." As defined in section 2(c) of the
- 6 act of April 23, 1956 (1955 P.L.1510, No.500), known as the
- 7 Disease Prevention and Control Law of 1955.
- 8 "County." A county or home rule charter county of any
- 9 classification.
- 10 "Governing body." The board of county commissioners or the
- 11 county executive or other person exercising the functions of the
- 12 county executive in a county without a board of county
- 13 <u>commissioners.</u>
- "Industry." A particular form or branch of economic or
- 15 commercial activity.
- 16 "Public health emergency." A declaration of disaster
- 17 emergency declared by the Governor under section 7301(c)
- 18 (relating to general authority of Governor).
- 19 § 5902. Reopening plan for businesses.
- 20 (a) Reopening plan. -- Notwithstanding section 7301 (relating
- 21 to general authority of Governor), sections 2102 and 2106 of the
- 22 act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The
- 23 Administrative Code of 1929, section 8(a) of the act of April
- 24 27, 1905 (P.L.312, No.218), entitled "An act creating a
- 25 Department of Health, and defining its powers and duties, " and
- 26 section 5 of the act of April 23, 1956 (1955 P.L.1510, No.500),
- 27 known as the Disease Prevention and Control Law of 1955, the
- 28 governing body of a county, in consultation with the county
- 29 emergency management agency, county health department, county
- 30 health officer or any other appropriate health or emergency

- 1 management official, including any contracted official, may
- 2 <u>develop and implement a countywide reopening plan for businesses</u>
- 3 subject to closure by the Governor due to the spread of a
- 4 <u>communicable disease during a public health emergency.</u>
- 5 (b) Modifications. -- At any time, the governing body of a
- 6 county, in consultation with the county emergency management
- 7 agency, county health department, county health officer or any
- 8 other appropriate health or emergency management official,
- 9 including any contracted official, may take an action to modify
- 10 the countywide reopening plan for businesses to expand or
- 11 restrict the industries authorized to operate in the county or
- 12 rescind the countywide reopening plan for businesses entirely.
- (c) Limitation.--Nothing in this section shall be construed
- 14 <u>to:</u>
- 15 <u>(1) require a county to rescind a local declaration of</u>
- 16 <u>emergency relating to a communicable disease; or</u>
- 17 (2) revoke, rescind or overrule the proclamation of
- disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020,
- 19 <u>published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and any renewal</u>
- of the state of disaster emergency.
- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
