## AN ACT

- Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in licensing of drivers, further providing for 1

- 20 § 3327. Duty of driver in emergency response areas.
- 21 (a) General rule. -- When approaching or passing an emergency
- 22 response area, a person, unless otherwise directed by an
- 23 emergency service responder, shall:
- 24 (1) pass in a lane not adjacent to that of the emergency 25 response area, if possible; or
- 26 (2) if passing in a nonadjacent lane is impossible,
- 27 illegal or unsafe, pass the emergency response area at a
- [careful and prudent reduced] speed at least 20 miles per
- 29 <u>hour less than the posted speed limit and</u> reasonable for
- 30 safely passing the emergency response area.

- 1 (b) Penalty. -- Any person violating subsection (a) commits a
- 2 summary offense and shall, upon conviction, pay:
- 3 (1) For a first offense, a fine of [not more than \$250]
- 4 \$500.
- 5 (2) For a second offense, a fine of [not more than \$500]
- 6 <u>\$1,000</u>.
- 7 (3) For a third or subsequent offense, a fine of [not
- 8 more than \$1,000] \$2,000.

- 10 (e.1) Public awareness. -- The department shall educate the
- 11 public of the provisions of this section [as it deems
- 12 appropriate] periodically throughout the year and maintain
- 13 information on the department's publicly accessible Internet
- 14 <u>website. The department shall refer to the education effort as</u>
- 15 the "Move Over" campaign.

- 17 Section 2. This act may be referred to as the Move Over Law.
- 18 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
