## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of April 2019 as "Child Abuse Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Each year, more than 1 million children in the
- 4 United States are documented as the victims of child abuse; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In 2017, there were 4,693 substantiated cases of
- 6 child abuse in this Commonwealth, with 40 children dying as a
- 7 direct result of abuse and neglect and 88 children nearly losing
- 8 their lives; and
- 9 WHEREAS, These tragic numbers reflect the unsettling reality
- 10 that thousands of children in this Commonwealth go to bed hurt,
- 11 hungry, cold and alone or live every day in fear of the very
- 12 people who should be protecting them; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Although the General Assembly has passed measures in
- 14 recent years to bolster screening for caregivers, improve
- 15 reporting, stiffen penalties and fortify investigations, child
- 16 abuse and neglect remain, and the secretiveness which surrounds
- 17 child abuse and neglect in far too many families in this

- 1 Commonwealth is especially difficult to combat; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The heroin and opioid epidemic, which continues to
- 3 claim the lives of 15 Pennsylvanians every day, often victimizes
- 4 the children of parents struggling with addiction, with infants
- 5 and young children frequently left unsupervised and unsupported
- 6 in the most unsafe and unsanitary of conditions; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Child abuse crosses all racial, economic and
- 8 geographic boundaries; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The damaging effects of child abuse include school
- 10 failure, alcohol and drug abuse and physical and psychological
- 11 difficulties; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Child abuse can and must be prevented and awareness
- 13 raised so that families can learn that they have access to
- 14 community resources which offer support, information and
- 15 guidance to help stop or prevent abusive behaviors or
- 16 conditions; and
- 17 WHEREAS, By working to enhance awareness of child abuse and
- 18 prevent and end abusive behaviors and environments, we
- 19 demonstrate our collective commitment to breaking the vicious
- 20 cycle of abuse and creating a safe, nurturing, loving
- 21 environment for every infant and child in this Commonwealth; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Many Pennsylvanians in schools, social service
- 23 agencies, churches and neighborhood groups throughout this
- 24 Commonwealth are working to support the victims of child abuse
- 25 and prevent future abuse; and
- 26 WHEREAS, In spite of these efforts, more needs to be done to
- 27 guarantee a childhood free of abuse and victimization to every
- 28 child in this Commonwealth; therefore be it
- 29 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2019
- 30 as "Child Abuse Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it

- 5 preventing the tragedy of child abuse.
