INTRODUCED AND ADOPTED, APRIL 30, 2019

A RESOLUTION

- Designating April 30, 2019, as "Pennsylvania Health Care Information Technology Awareness Day."
- 3 WHEREAS, United States health care spending increased 3.9%
- 4 in 2017, reaching \$3.5 trillion, or \$10,739 per person; and
- 5 WHEREAS, As a share of Gross Domestic Product, health care
- 6 spending was 18% in 2016, up from 17.7% in 2015; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Over the last decade, health care spending has grown
- 8 by more than 40%; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The health care industry invests only 3% to 6% of
- 10 its revenue on information technology and management systems;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, Similar investments by other data-intensive
- 13 industries, such as banking and financial services, range from
- 14 4.4% to 11.4%; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Health care information technology has led to
- 16 improved guideline adherence, better disease surveillance and
- 17 greater use of patient-centered care; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Health care information technology has reduced
- 2 medication errors and adverse drug events and lessened
- 3 disparities in access to care; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Annual Promoting Interoperability Programs reporting
- 5 for Medicare Eligible Professionals, Medicaid Eligible
- 6 Professionals and Eligible Hospitals and Critical Access
- 7 Hospitals, indicates 546,644 Unique Providers paid through
- 8 October 2018; and
- 9 WHEREAS, For the same period, the Amount Paid, Program to
- 10 Date, reached \$38,422,505,920; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The digital transformation is driving global
- 12 information technology spending to more than \$3.7 trillion, its
- 13 highest level; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Enterprise software followed by information
- 15 technology services are spurring this trend; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Artificial intelligence, cognitive computing,
- 17 security software, machine learning and blockchain technology
- 18 are other drivers of spending growth; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The Internet of Things, mobility tools, data
- 20 analytics/business intelligence, information exchange and
- 21 communication systems are projected drivers of future spending
- 22 growth; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The health care industry is experiencing its highest
- 24 rates of change, requiring budget increases to implement and
- 25 monitor advancements; and
- 26 WHEREAS, The Office of the National Coordinator for Health
- 27 Information Technology has outlined benefits of information
- 28 technology; and
- 29 WHEREAS, These benefits relate to medical record transparency
- 30 and accuracy, coordinated care and overuse of tests and

- 1 procedures; and
- 2 WHEREAS, According to the Institute of Medicine, at least 1.5
- 3 million preventable adverse drug events occur every year, each
- 4 adding more than \$8,700 to the cost of a hospital stay; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services
- 6 reports \$1,722,624,114.51 in combined Medicare and Medicaid
- 7 spending under Promoting Interoperability Programs from January
- 8 2011 through October 2018; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Office of the National Coordinator for Health
- 10 Information Technology reports that 92% of eligible hospitals
- 11 and 83% of ambulatory health care providers in this Commonwealth
- 12 have adopted certified electronic health records; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Health care providers in this Commonwealth have
- 14 noted an improved ability to recruit physicians coming out of
- 15 medical school when advanced information technology is deployed;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, Members and supporters of the Healthcare Information
- 18 and Management Systems Society (HIMSS) encourage greater access
- 19 to comprehensive care for rural Pennsylvanians; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Recommendations include expanded use of telehealth
- 21 through enactment of Federal telemedicine legislation, workforce
- 22 development funding and adoption of interoperability standards;
- 23 therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate April 30, 2019, as
- 25 "Pennsylvania Health Care Information Technology Awareness Day";
- 26 and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize that quality, safety and
- 28 cost effectiveness gains are achievable when information
- 29 technology and information exchange are applied to health care;
- 30 and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the Senate welcome HIMSS members and
- 2 supporters to the State Capitol, acknowledging a common goal of
- 3 securing better health care that integrates information
- 4 technology and information exchange.
