## A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of May 2019 as "Melanoma and Skin Cancer Detection and Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Most people do not realize that skin is the largest
- 4 and most visible organ of the body and performs many essential
- 5 tasks such as regulating body temperature, protecting internal
- 6 organs, providing sensation and supporting metabolic functions;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, One in five Americans are likely to develop skin
- 9 cancer in their lifetime; and
- 10 WHEREAS, More than 3 million cases of nonmelanoma skin cancer
- 11 are diagnosed in the United States each year; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Estimates show there will be 192,310 new cases of
- 13 melanoma, the deadliest form of skin cancer, diagnosed in the
- 14 United States in 2019; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Melanoma is the most common form of cancer for young
- 16 adults between 25 and 29 years of age and the second-most common

- 1 form of cancer for adolescents and young adults between 15 and
- 2 29 years of age; and
- 3 WHEREAS, While the rates of melanoma have increased for the
- 4 last 30 years, melanoma and other skin cancers are highly
- 5 treatable if detected early; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Sun exposure is the most preventable risk factor for
- 7 all skin cancers, including melanoma; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the month of May 2019 as
- 9 "Melanoma and Skin Cancer Detection and Prevention Month" in
- 10 Pennsylvania.
