A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of May 2019 as "Childhood Trauma Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Research over the last two decades from the evolving
- 4 fields of neuroscience, molecular biology, public health and
- 5 epigenetics reveals that experiences in the first 1,000 days of
- 6 life build changes into the biology of the human body, which in
- 7 turn influence a lifetime of physical and mental health; and
- 8 WHEREAS, These early experiences shape the physical
- 9 architecture of a child's developing brain and establish either
- 10 a resilient or a fragile foundation for all the learning, health
- 11 and behavior that follows; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Exposure to chronic stress and trauma in early
- 13 childhood caused by numerous conditions, including extreme
- 14 poverty, repeated abuse, neglect, parental substance abuse and
- 15 domestic violence, are toxic to a child's developing brain; and
- 16 WHEREAS, A critical factor in buffering children from the
- 17 effects of toxic stress is the existence of safe, stable

- 1 relationships between children and their families, caregivers
- 2 and other important people in their lives with support by
- 3 trauma-informed service systems; and
- 4 WHEREAS, It is more effective and less costly to positively
- 5 influence the architecture of a young child's developing brain
- 6 than to attempt to correct poor learning, health and behaviors
- 7 later in life; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Nearly 50% of all children in Pennsylvania and 45%
- 9 of all children in the United States have experienced one or
- 10 more adverse childhood experiences, including abuse and neglect,
- 11 which are potentially traumatizing experiences; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The cumulative economic and social costs of complex
- 13 trauma in childhood places a significant burden on the country,
- 14 including an estimated \$103.8 billion annually in direct and
- 15 indirect treatment and support costs, as well as lost
- 16 productivity to society; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Childhood trauma results in poor educational
- 18 outcomes, with children that experience four or more adverse
- 19 childhood experiences being twice as likely to have learning and
- 20 behavioral problems, and students with three or more adverse
- 21 childhood experiences being significantly more likely to be
- 22 unable to perform at grade level, placed in special education,
- 23 be suspended, expelled or drop out of school; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Up to 90% of youth in the criminal justice system
- 25 report exposure to traumatic childhood events; therefore be it
- 26 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the month of May 2019 as
- 27 "Childhood Trauma Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
