A RESOLUTION

- Designating May 25, 2019, as "Missing Adult Persons Remembrance Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, On any given day, it is estimated there are more
- 4 than 80,000 missing adult persons in the United States; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Currently more than 300 adults in this Commonwealth
- 6 are among the missing; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Persons go missing for a variety of reasons,
- 8 including mental illness, addiction, abduction, natural
- 9 disasters and intentional disappearance; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Missing adult person cases are difficult to solve
- 11 due to a lack of crime scene and forensic evidence; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Since the reporting of missing adult persons is
- 13 voluntary, the reporting rate is very low; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Even when missing adults are reported, Federal,
- 15 State, local and nonprofit databases are not connected, making
- 16 it challenging for advocates to share information; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State Police, local law enforcement

- 1 agencies, medical examiners, coroners, criminal justice
- 2 professionals and family members work to resolve these
- 3 difficult, heartbreaking cases; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The National Crime Information Center's Missing
- 5 Person File implemented in the Federal Bureau of Investigation
- 6 is a computerized database of documented criminal justice
- 7 information accessible only to law enforcement agencies; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Namus, the National Missing and Unidentified Persons
- 9 System created by the United States Department of Justice in
- 10 2007, is a publicly searchable, online database that serves as a
- 11 national repository for case information on missing persons; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Increased coordination is necessary between our
- 13 national missing persons organizations so that stakeholders and
- 14 families find it easier to navigate the complex systems and
- 15 improve the ability to access critical information; therefore be
- 16 it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate May 25, 2019, as "Missing
- 18 Adult Persons Remembrance Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it
- 19 further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize all missing adult persons
- 21 in our nation and our Commonwealth and laud the systems
- 22 currently in place and the work to be done to facilitate data
- 23 sharing and enhance reporting, investigation and resolution of
- 24 missing adult person cases.
