A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing October 24, 2019, as "Lights on Afterschool Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, After-school programs and opportunities provide
- 4 safe, challenging and engaging learning experiences which help
- 5 children develop social, emotional, physical and academic skills
- 6 and engage families, school and community partners in advancing
- 7 the welfare of children; and
- 8 WHEREAS, After-school programs support working families by
- 9 ensuring that children are safe and productive after the regular
- 10 school day ends and build stronger communities by involving
- 11 students, parents, business leaders and adult volunteers in the
- 12 lives of young people to promote positive relationships among
- 13 youth, families and adults; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Statewide Afterschool Youth
- 15 Development Network has provided significant leadership in the
- 16 area of community involvement in the education and well-being of
- 17 our youth, grounded in the principle that quality after-school

- 1 programs are key in helping our children become successful
- 2 adults; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Lights on Afterschool, the national celebration of
- 4 after school programs, promotes the importance of quality after
- 5 school programs in the lives of children, families and
- 6 communities; and
- 7 WHEREAS, More than 28 million children in the United States
- 8 have parents who work outside the home and 19.4 million children
- 9 have nowhere to go after school; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Many after-school programs across the country are
- 11 facing funding short falls so severe that the programs are being
- 12 forced to close the doors and turn off the lights; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is committed to
- 14 investing in the health and safety of all young people by
- 15 providing expanded learning opportunities that will help close
- 16 the achievement gap and prepare young people to compete in the
- 17 global economy; therefore be it
- 18 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize October 24, 2019, as
- 19 "Lights on Afterschool Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Senate enthusiastically endorse Lights on
- 21 Afterschool and commit our Commonwealth to engage in innovative
- 22 after-school programs and activities that ensure the lights stay
- 23 on and the doors stay open for all children after school.
