AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," in pupils and attendance, further 5 providing for definitions and for excuses from attending 6 7 school. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The definition of "unexcused absence" in section 10 1326 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the 11 12 Public School Code of 1949, is amended to read: 13 Section 1326. Definitions. -- When used in this article, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings: 14 * * * 15 "Unexcused absence" shall mean an absence from school which 16 17 is not permitted by the provisions of section 1329 and for which 18 an approved explanation has not been submitted within the time 19 period and in the manner prescribed by the governing body. An 20 out-of-school suspension or an absence related to a medical condition that is explained by a valid medical excuse from a 21

- 1 <u>licensed practitioner of the healing arts in any state</u>,
- 2 commonwealth or territory may not be considered an unexcused
- 3 absence.
- 4 Section 2. Section 1329(a) of the act is amended and the
- 5 section is amended by adding subsections to read:
- 6 Section 1329. Excuses from Attending School.--(a) The board
- 7 of school directors of any school district [may] shall, upon
- 8 certification by any licensed practitioner of the healing arts
- 9 or upon any other satisfactory evidence being furnished to it,
- 10 showing that any child or children are prevented from attending
- 11 school, or from application to study, on account of any mental,
- 12 physical, or other urgent reasons, excuse such child or children
- 13 from attending school as required by the provisions of this act.
- 14 [, but the term "urgent reasons" shall be strictly construed and
- 15 shall not permit of irregular attendance. In every such case,
- 16 such action by the board of school directors shall not be final
- 17 until the approval of the Department of Education has been
- 18 obtained. Every principal or teacher in any public, private, or
- 19 other school may, for reasons enumerated above, excuse any child
- 20 for non-attendance during temporary periods.]
- 21 * * *
- 22 <u>(a.3) The board of school directors of a school district may</u>
- 23 <u>excuse a child or children from attending school as required by</u>
- 24 the provisions of this act for urgent reasons, but the term
- 25 <u>"urgent reasons" shall be strictly construed and shall not</u>
- 26 permit irregular attendance. In each case, the action by the
- 27 board of school directors shall not be final until the approval
- 28 of the Department of Education has been obtained.
- 29 <u>(a.4) Every principal or teacher in a public, private or</u>
- 30 other school may, for reasons enumerated in subsections (a) and

- 1 (a.3), excuse a child for non-attendance during temporary
- 2 <u>periods</u>.

- 4 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
