## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the COVID-19 Child-care Grant Program; providing
- for duties of the Department of Community and Economic
- 3 Development; and making an appropriation.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the COVID-19
- 8 Child-care Grant Program Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Adjusted monthly family income." Gross countable family
- 14 income per month, minus allowable deductions.
- 15 "Annual family income." The adjusted monthly family income,
- 16 multiplied by 12 months.
- 17 "Caretaker." An individual who has legal custody of a child,

- 1 a foster parent of a child, a grandparent of a child or an aunt
- 2 or uncle of a child who lives with and exercises care and
- 3 control of the child.
- 4 "Child care." Care in lieu of parental care for part of a
- 5 24-hour day by an eligible provider, as defined in 55 Pa. Code §
- 6 3041.13(a) (relating to parent choice), or a relative of the
- 7 child who provides the care for the child if the relative
- 8 complies with the applicable State requirements for providing
- 9 the care.
- "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an infectious
- 11 disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus
- 12 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in Wuhan,
- 13 China.
- 14 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic
- 15 Development of the Commonwealth.
- 16 "Family." A child for whom subsidized child care is
- 17 requested and any of the following individuals who live with the
- 18 child in the same household:
- 19 (1) A parent of the child.
- 20 (2) A caretaker and the caretaker's spouse.
- 21 (3) A biological, adoptive or foster child or stepchild
- of the parent or caretaker who is under 18 years of age and
- not emancipated by marriage or by the court.
- 24 (4) An unrelated child under the care and control of the
- 25 parent or caretaker who is under 18 years of age and not
- 26 emancipated by marriage or by the court.
- 27 (5) A child who is:
- 28 (i) 18 years of age or older but under 22 years of
- 29 age;
- 30 (ii) enrolled in a high school, general educational

- development program or postsecondary program leading to a
- 2 degree, diploma or certificate; and
- 3 (iii) wholly or partially dependent upon the income
- 4 of the parent or caretaker or spouse of the parent or
- 5 caretaker.
- 6 "FPIG." The Federal poverty income guidelines, which are the
- 7 income levels published annually in the Federal Register by the
- 8 United States Department of Health and Human Services.
- 9 "Income." Includes the following:
- 10 (1) Earned income, including gross wages from work, cash
- and in-kind payments received by an individual in exchange
- for services and income from self-employment.
- 13 (2) Unearned income, including cash and contributions
- 14 received by an individual for which the individual does not
- 15 provide a service.
- 16 (3) Unearned benefits received periodically by an
- individual, such as unemployment compensation, workers'
- 18 compensation or retirement benefits.
- 19 "Parent." A biological or adoptive mother or father,
- 20 stepmother or stepfather of a child who exercises care and
- 21 control of the child for whom subsidy is requested.
- 22 "Proclamation of disaster emergency." The proclamation of
- 23 disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020,
- 24 published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and any renewal of
- 25 the state of disaster emergency.
- 26 "Program." The COVID-19 Child-care Grant Program established
- 27 under section 3.
- 28 Section 3. COVID-19 Child-care Grant Program.
- 29 (a) Establishment.--The COVID-19 Child-care Grant Program is
- 30 established within the department.

- 1 (b) Duties of department. -- The department shall provide
- 2 grants under the program in accordance with this act to
- 3 reimburse parents or caretakers for child-care expenses incurred
- 4 as a result of COVID-19 as identified in the proclamation of
- 5 disaster emergency.
- 6 Section 4. Grant application forms.
- 7 (a) Development. -- The department shall develop a grant
- 8 application form for parents or caretakers to apply for a grant
- 9 under the program.
- 10 (b) Contents. -- At minimum, the grant application form shall
- 11 include the following information:
- 12 (1) The name, address, contact information and annual
- family income of the applicant.
- 14 (2) The name, age and child-care provider for each child
- of the applicant.
- 16 (3) The current cost of child care required and paid by
- 17 the applicant.
- 18 (4) The amount of grant money requested under the
- 19 program.
- 20 (5) Any other information that the department deems
- 21 necessary and appropriate.
- 22 (c) Submission. -- A parent or caretaker must submit the grant
- 23 application form required under this section to the department
- 24 in the manner prescribed to be eligible for a grant under the
- 25 program.
- 26 Section 5. Eligibility.
- 27 Grant applications shall be open to all parents or caretakers
- 28 with annual family income greater than 200% of the FPIG but less
- 29 than 400% of the FPIG.
- 30 Section 6. Applicability.

- 1 This act shall apply to:
- 2 (1) Child care costs for a child from the birth of the
- 3 child until the day prior to the date of the child's 14th
- 4 birthday.
- 5 (2) At the discretion of the department, child-care
- 6 costs for a child with a disability through 18 years of age.
- 7 Section 7. Award of grants.
- 8 (a) Review of grants. -- Not later than 20 days after receipt
- 9 of the grant application form under section 4, the department
- 10 shall review the grant application form and determine whether to
- 11 award a grant to the applicant under the program and, if so, the
- 12 amount of grant money to be awarded.
- 13 (b) Consideration. -- In determining the amount of grant money
- 14 to be awarded to the applicant by the department, priority shall
- 15 be given to applicants with gross annual family income greater
- 16 than 200% of the FPIG but less than 300% of the FPIG.
- 17 (c) Notice.--After conducting a review of the grant
- 18 application under subsection (a), the department shall provide
- 19 written notice to the applicant of the award or denial of the
- 20 grant under the program. The following shall apply:
- 21 (1) Notice of the award of a grant under the program
- shall include the amount of the grant money awarded and all
- conditions or restrictions on the use of the grant money.
- 24 (2) Notice of the denial of all or part of the grant
- 25 money requested under the program on the grant application
- 26 under subsection (a) shall include the reasons for full or
- 27 partial denial.
- 28 Section 8. Guidelines.
- 29 The department may promulgate guidelines for the
- 30 implementation and administration of this act.

- 1 Section 9. Public notice.
- 2 (a) Availability of grants. -- The department shall provide
- 3 information regarding the availability of grants under the
- 4 program on the publicly accessible Internet website of the
- 5 department.
- 6 (b) Amount of grant money awarded. -- Following the
- 7 termination or expiration of the proclamation of disaster
- 8 emergency, the department shall post the amount of grant money
- 9 awarded on the publicly accessible Internet website of the
- 10 department.
- 11 Section 10. Limitation on award of grants.
- 12 Subject to the availability of funding, a grant to an
- 13 applicant under the program shall not exceed \$750 per month, per
- 14 child.
- 15 Section 11. Appropriation.
- The sum of \$50,000,000 is appropriated to the department on a
- 17 continuing basis from the COVID-19 Response Restricted Account
- 18 for the purposes of this act.
- 19 Section 12. Expiration.
- 20 (a) Notice. -- Upon the expiration or termination of the
- 21 proclamation of disaster emergency, the department shall
- 22 transmit notice of the expiration or termination to the
- 23 Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania
- 24 Bulletin.
- 25 (b) Authority.--The authority of the department to award
- 26 grants under the program shall expire three months after the
- 27 publication of the notice required in subsection (a).
- 28 Section 13. Effective date.
- 29 This act shall take effect in 30 days.
