AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in professional and occupational
- licenses, providing for military medical personnel pilot
- 4 program.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 7504. Military medical personnel pilot program.
- 10 (a) Establishment.--The Department of Health and the
- 11 Department of State in consultation with the department shall
- 12 establish a pilot program in which military medical personnel
- 13 may practice and perform certain delegated duties that
- 14 constitute the practice of medicine under the supervision of a
- 15 physician or podiatrist who holds an active, unrestricted
- 16 license issued by the Commonwealth. The duties shall reflect the
- 17 level of training and experience of the military medical

- 1 personnel. The supervising physician or podiatrist shall retain_
- 2 <u>responsibility for the care of the patient.</u>
- 3 (b) Participation. -- A licensed physician, podiatrist,
- 4 hospital or medical facility that is supervised by one or more
- 5 physicians or podiatrists may participate in the pilot program.
- 6 (c) Requirements.--The departments listed under subsection
- 7 (a) shall establish general requirements for participating
- 8 <u>military medical personnel, licensees and employers.</u>
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
